SPECIAL LIBRARIES IN THE 1980's - BARREN RIVER LAKE

A state-of-the-art review of library technology, presented by Professor Clayton Shepherd, of the Indiana University Graduate Library School, will highlight a meeting titled "Special Libraries in the 1980's," set for May 1 and 2 at Barren River Lake State Park.

The meeting will be sponsored by the Special Section of the Kentucky Library Association and the Kentucky Chapter of the Special Libraries Association.

Also on the program is Robert Carter, of the Council on Higher Education. Carter will speak on telecommunications for Kentucky libraries.

Topics such as microform technology and practical applications of technology will also be discussed at the meeting.

The cost is \$5.00 for one day and \$8.00 for two days for members and \$7.00 for one day and \$10.00 for two days for non-members.
