## Add/Drop: A call away

System received test run;  
to be restarted Aug. 26

Add/Drop is as close as the nearest telephone this fall, which means students could spend minutes on the phone line rather than hours in the registration line.

The long-awaited UK Voice Information Processing network finally has arrived with a promise from administrators that phone registration will allow UK students to advance register for classes and to Add/Drop classes with ease and efficiency.

"Phone registration will be convenient for students and will improve the quality of services offered them by the University," University Registrar Randall Dahl said.

Students can access UK-VIP by using a touch-tone telephone and dialing 9-257-9500 on campus or 257-9500 off-campus. Voice messages will tell students what to do at each step of the process, and students will be required to enter the necessary information.

Lisa Collins, assistant registrar for registration, said security was a big question on the minds of administrators at the beginning of the project. Because only a student's social security number and birthdate are needed to access the system, officials feared that an unauthorized person could make fraudulent schedule changes.

Collins said other campuses using VIP reported unauthorized schedule tampering, but he said the schedule changes were corrected easily.

Because of concerns about security, Collins said UK officials put a fail-safe mechanism into the VIP system. He said students who feel uncertain about the security of their class schedules can go to Room 10 of the Funkhouser Building and get a personal four-digit number to replace the birthdate code.

Collins said, however, that "almost all institutions using VIP that we talked to indicated security was not a problem for them."

Full instructions on how to use the new phone registration system are listed on pages 16-20 in the Fall 1993 Schedule of Classes.

Students who advance registered during the spring semester had the opportunity to Add/Drop using VIP from July 26 through Aug. 16. UK-VIP was turned off in the evening on Aug. 16 so that courses and scheduling could be updated.

The system won't be available for Add/Drop again until Thursday. "Since it is the first time that we've used the new system, we are not ready to do an opening of term with the system," Collins said. "But students should be able to advance register via VIP in November and the system should be available during the opening of term in January."

## Officials not sure of UK-VIP impact

UK officials said they cannot estimate how much of a dent the new telephone registration system will make in Add/Drop lines this semester.

But Lisa Collins, assistant registrar for registration, said about 2,800 students have used the new UK Voice Information Processing network so far.

"We know VIP has taken a load off, but we don't know how much," said Collins, who added that the early estimates are "very rough."

Collins said the registrar's office does not have the capability to find out exactly how many students used UK-VIP during its trial run.

Students were given the opportunity to use the system from July 26 until Aug. 16. The system then was shut down to prepare for Add/Drop, which begins Tuesday. UK-VIP will resume operation Thursday with Add/Drop continuing until Aug. 31.

"We knew we weren't smart enough to do it on the phone for the first time during the fall semester," Collins said. "We are taking the conservative, cautious approach."

Collins said students should be able to register on UK-VIP sometime in November and that Add/Drop could be conducted entirely over the phone by January.

As for the fall, Collins said the registrar's office is preparing for Add/Drop crowds equal to the last few years. She estimated that between 2,000 to 3,000 students go through Add/Drop each semester.

"It's definitely a wait-and-see (situation), but we are preparing for a 3,000 figure," Collins said.

The central site for Add/Drop this year has been moved from the Patterson Office Tower mezzanine to 230 Student Center. This site may be used by students enrolled in The Graduate School or the Colleges of Communications and Information Sciences; Education; Business and Economics; and Arts and Sciences.

Students in other colleges should check with their dean's offices to locate their Add/Drop sites. The Student Center location will be open from 8 a.m. to noon, and from 1 to 7 p.m. All other locations will have the same hours, but will close one hour earlier.

Officials are urging students who plan to Add/Drop to come at their scheduled times to avoid unnecessary waiting.

The worst time to Add/Drop is 1 to 4 p.m., so students should arrive on time so that won't make the wait any longer," Collins said.

The procedure for Add/Drop will be virtually the same as in previous years, she said.

Check-in for Add/Drop will be on the second floor of the New Student Center in the Music Listening Lounge, and the Student Center patio will be used as a waiting area for students. In the event of rain, students will be allowed to wait inside.

One new feature of Add/Drop, called conditional enrollment, will begin this fall. This new system will prevent students from enrolling in restricted classes without the consent of the instructor.

Students trying to enter into a restricted course will be asked to go to the department offering the course and get permission from the instructor.

Collins said that students will be able to use the UK-VIP system to enter classes instead of going back through the line.

## Student denied seat on education panel

The chairman of the Board of Student Body Presidents has promised that the organization will continue its fight to get student representation on the governor's new committee to help restructure higher education.

"Every time you are putting everything on the table, you need student input," said Lance Dowdy, UK Student Government Association president and chairman of the student board.

The board, composed of student presidents from Kentucky's eight state-supported universities, met

last Sunday and decided to write to Gov. Breton Jones asking that a student be placed on the committee so students across the state would have a voice in the group's discussion.

Dowdy wrote the letter, which was signed by the other student body presidents and sent to Frankfort early last week. Dowdy learned Wednesday that a student will not be allowed to serve on the committee.

The presidents of the eight state universities were asked during a closed-door meeting with the governor less than two weeks ago to serve on the committee. The governor wants the group to look at issues ranging from the programs of-

fered by each school to the way the universities are funded.

Michael Hammonds, the state Boards and Commissions director, said the governor asked the state-supported universities' presidents and each of the chairmen from the schools' governing bodies to serve on the committee, but he said there would not be a student member on the new committee.

"This is just an informal group of presidents and board chairmen. The board chairmen will represent the constituency of the schools, but the committee will not include students," Hammonds said.

Dowdy said the Board of Student Body Presidents will have a re-

sponse to the decision.

"It's not that we don't think the administrators can't handle it, but we feel that students should be represented on the board," he said.

Gary Cox, executive director of the Council on Higher Education, said, however, that this committee is different from others in state government.

"It is not meant to be a representative group. This committee has a very short time to work, and it is appropriate for the board chairmen to represent the constituency from their respective schools," Cox said.

However, Don Pace, Eastern Kentucky University's student body president said that he felt that stu-

dent involvement was vital.

"It seemed to me like it was an obvious choice. We just never considered it the other way," Pace said. "We all pretty much figured that we would have a representative on the board."

"A store would not test market a product without using consumers," Dowdy said. "However, it seems like a different route is being taken with higher education, and we don't want it to go that route."

The governor's committee has not met yet, so the members have not formulated an agenda. Jones has asked that the committee have a report on its findings ready by Nov. 1.

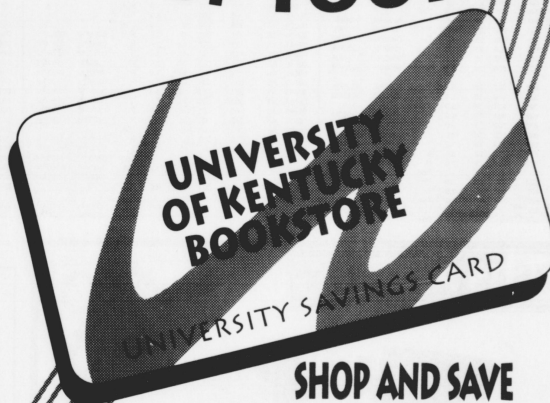

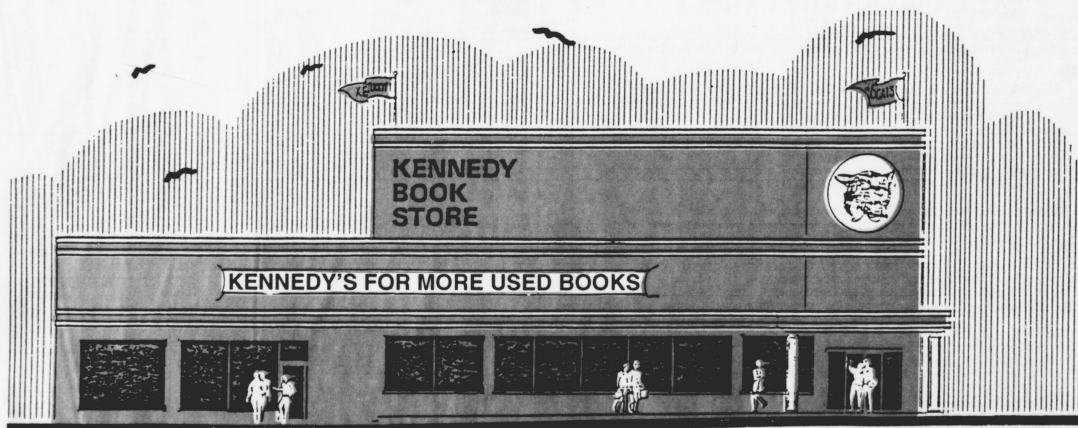

## Ivy, DeBoer earn promotions

DeFilippo's departure opens positions

Larry Ivy has been promoted to senior associate athletics director and Kathy DeBoer has been named associate athletics director, UK Athletics Director C.M. Newton announced Aug. 6.

The promotions are part of a departmental restructuring process following the departure of former UK Associate Athletics Director Gene DeFilippo, who accepted the Athletics Director position at Villanova University Aug. 2.

DeBoer, who is in her ninth year at UK, has doubled as volleyball coach and assistant AD for individual and selected team sports. As associate AD, she will relinquish her role as coach to oversee all operations, game management, marketing and promotions for UK's 19 non-revenue-producing sports.

DeBoer said the decision to leave coaching had two sides.

"Those 13 years I spent coaching are some of the best years of my life. I felt like I had 13 years to play. (The promotion) was a good opportunity for me. I couldn't turn it down."

Newton helped DeBoer by taking the pressure off her.

"He had some great words of wisdom for me," DeBoer said. "He wanted me to make sure I was ready to leave coaching before I did it."

cult decision to give up coaching," Newton said. "I personally know that's a tough thing to do. But I'm confident that she, just like Larry, will do an outstanding job."

DeBoer said she longs for certain parts of coaching.

"I don't miss recruiting, summer camps and losing," she said. "I miss winning, and I miss the relationship with the players on the team. That's what I miss already."

UK assistant volleyball coach Fran Ralston-Flory has been named interim coach. A permanent coach will be named at a later date, Newton said.

Ivy is in his 17th year with UK. As senior associate AD, Ivy will be

responsible for the operations, game management and marketing and promotions of UK's two revenue-producing sports — football and men's basketball. He will continue his role as supervisor of the department's finances, ticket office operations and facilities.

Ivy also will oversee the Athletic Department's medical and training services, and computer and video operations.

"Larry Ivy has been a valuable part of the Athletics Department for a long time," Newton said. "I am very excited for him."

Newton also announced that former DeFilippo assistant Kyle Moats has been promoted to director of

marketing and promotions and that John Cropp, who has served as athletics recruiting coordinator for two years, will take over as assistant AD for special projects.

"In this era of cost containment, and with the NCAA legislating that we cut back on number of coaches, I think it's significant to note that we are eliminating an administrative position by reassigning responsibilities," Newton said.

"Gene isn't actually being replaced, but his responsibilities are being doled out to others. I am pleased that our staff is solid enough and talented enough that we are able to do that."

## SPORTS BRIEFS

### Ford, Brassow have surgery

UK basketball players Travis Ford and Jeff Brassow both had knee surgeries this summer.

Ford, a 5-foot-9 senior point guard, had an operation to repair a partial tear of his right lateral and medial meniscus Aug. 10.

UK team physician Dr. Mary Lloyd Ireland performed the procedure in Lexington. Ford sustained the injuries while playing in the World University Games this summer in Buffalo, N.Y.

Brassow, who had arthroscopic surgery Aug. 11 in New York City, also tore his medial meniscus.

The operation stemmed from the same injury Brassow incurred last season.

Both procedures were performed without incident.

Ford and Brassow have started rehabilitation and are expected to be ready for the first day of conditioning, Aug. 30.

### Volleyball team earns national ranking

The UK women's volleyball team has received two Top 20 pre-season rankings. The Wildcats enter the 1993 campaign as the No. 14 team in Volleyball Monthly's Top 20 and the No. 18 team in the American Volleyball Coaches Association's Top 25.

UK returns five starters, including All-Southeastern Conference and All-South region performers Eunice Thomas, Krista Robinson and Jane Belanger from last year's squad, which compiled a 25-9 record while advancing to the NCAA Final 16.

The Cats begin their season Sept. 1 at Miami (Ohio) in a 7 p.m. match. UK opens its home schedule serving host to the Big Four Classic Sept. 3-4, competing against Louisville, Indiana and Notre Dame.

### Abbott, Reed star in summer league

UK baseball players Jeff Abbott and Brian Reed had a successful summer season with the Cincinnati Spirit of the Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League, helping the team to a second-place finish.

The Spirit broke 12 offensive club records, thanks in part to Abbott and Reed.

Abbott earned all-league honors, leading the league in batting average, slugging, RBIs, hits and doubles. He also was named the league's MVP. Abbott hit .392 with a league-record 56 hits and 15 doubles.

Reed also was named to all-league honors. The pitcher recorded the league's best ERA (1.53) while posting a 5-1 record and earning one save. Reed led the Spirit in winning percentage, innings and strikeouts.

### McKinley won't return to Lady Kats

Becky McKinley, a freshman on the 1992-93 UK women's basketball squad, will not play next season for her sophomore year. According to UK coach Sharon Fanning, McKinley has decided to stay home in Mt. Washington because of personal reasons.

### UK names assistant women's tennis coach

Kirsten Dreyer, a 1991 UCLA graduate, has been named women's tennis coach. UK head coach John Dinneen announced Aug. 17.

Dreyer played in three NCAA singles championships and was a member of the Bruin teams that advanced to two NCAA final rounds during 1988-91.

"We're very lucky to have a person of Kirsten's caliber on our coaching staff," Dinneen said. "She will certainly be a big boost to our program."

Dreyer holds four professional titles in singles and most recently coached and taught at the All-California Tennis Camp in Barsinghausen, Germany.

"I'm pleased to become a member of the UK coaching staff," Dreyer said. "It's a terrific challenge to coach at the collegiate level, especially in the Southeastern Conference."

## Student Activities Board busy this year

UK's Student Activities Board will present a wide array of campus activities this year, ranging from rock concerts to ski trips.

SAB activities for this fall include Parents' Weekend, Oct. 1-2, with a reception, brunch and football game; and Homecoming, Oct. 8-10, which includes a parade, pep rallies and concerts.

SAB, which was founded in 1963 and is among the oldest organizations on campus, also coordinates a number of unique programs like the Spotlight Jazz Series. This year's series will feature less-established jazz artists than in past years, SAB President Wes Butler said.

Another special SAB program is the Next Stage Series featuring performance artists. Scheduled for the 1993-94 Next Stage Series are composer Philip Glass, performance artist Laurie Anderson, and the Tony Award-winning National Theatre of the Deaf.

"We are monitoring him on a day to day basis," UK head trainer Al Green said. "The date of his full return (to practice) has yet to be determined, but we fully expect him to be ready for the first game against Kent."

The Wildcats are preparing for their season opener against Kent St. Sept. 4.

On Aug. 17, the football team got its first taste of real action.

"We've been waiting for this day a long time," UK football coach Bill Curry said after the first full practice. "We have a lot of things to prove this year, and it all starts when you put the pads on."

both very similar, is that you get a second chance to prove yourself, and we've been waiting for this since last Nov. 21.

That date was the final game of the season, a 34-13 loss at Tennessee.

"It is always a real exciting feeling during the first day of pads. This year I am particularly excited because of the extreme quickness and speed we have on our team.

"I sincerely believe that we have more speed on this team than on any other team I've ever coached."

Curry was happy to get his Cats onto the field in full attire.

"You've got to be a little crazy to play or coach football. A person has to collide with another person, knock him down, help him up and get ready to do it again. This is what's exciting about putting the pads on."

## Pat Benatar returns to rock music

Although her latest album is entitled *Gravity's Rainbow*, gravity seems to have had little effect on the powerful voice of Pat Benatar.

In 1979, Benatar and her band, which consists of Benatar's husband/guitarist Neil Giraldo, bassist Myron Grombacher and drummer Frank Linx, began producing such hits as "Hit Me With Your Best Shot" and "Love is a Battlefield."

Now it's 1993, and Top 40 radio, which helped make Benatar famous, is dead.

However, *Gravity's Rainbow*, Benatar's eleventh album, still offers an impressive batch of energetic rock and roll.

Benatar includes a variety of styles from the mandatory power-

lease off the album. "Everybody Lay Down".

The album also contains a number of blues tracks, which provide a needed diversion from the pop funk of the rest of the album. Benatar seems to have captured the spirit of the blues quite nicely. This may be a result of the experience Benatar gained off of her last album, *True Love*, which was solely devoted to the blues.

With "Crazy," Benatar and her

band seem comfortable stretching to the blue genre, while keeping the quick tempo of other songs on the album.

Benatar primarily relies upon the melodic hooks that have been recycled and reincarnated by other Top 40 artists. However, thematically, her music is fresh and timely.

A common theme throughout the album is the need for escape. The melodic "Every Time I Fall Back" and guitar-driven "Sanctuary" ex-

press a need for shelter from the ensuing anxiety crisis of the 1990s.

Benatar hints at a solution in "Kingdom Key." In it, she croons, "It's a great, great, temptation/in your hour of need/there's no shortcut to salvation/since you hold the kingdom key."

Benatar's voice, however, is what makes this album work. While most singers today gag on their own monotone screams, Benatar shows off her flexible vocal style — a result of many years of classical vocal training.

On "Somebody's Baby," Benatar keeps her singing smooth and unpushed. However, she can still scream it up with the best of them (on pitch of course) with "Everybody Lay Down" and "The Ties That Bind." These tracks truly demonstrate the power of Benatar's voice, which has allowed her music to last for more than a decade.

But Benatar delivers her finest vocal performance on the bluesy tunes, "Crazy" and "Rise (Part 2)." With these songs, she presents the higher, operatic portion of her vocal repertoire. Most contemporary artists never develop that part of their voices.

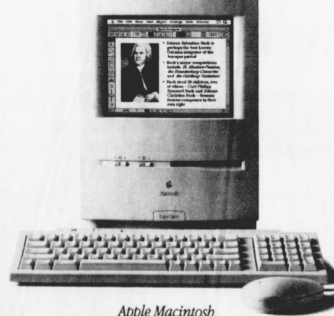
With the death of Top 40, Benatar may never be as popular as she once was. Still, *Gravity's Rainbow* is a worthwhile listening experience.
