

On motion of Prof Anderson seconded by Prof Brooks, it was ordered "that President Patterson be requested, as the representative of the Faculty, to be present with at the meetings of the investigating Com. of the Board of Trustees, if sanctioned by said com., to cooperate with them in their investigation of the Goods incident."

The letters to and from Maj. Mc Kee relative to his attendance upon this meeting of the faculty were read and upon motion it was ordered that they be made a part of the minutes of the Faculty.

Adoption of verdict. "Goods" case.

The report of the com. on the verdict in the Goods case was then considered and after the adoption of section by section it was upon motion of Prof Kastle adopted as a whole.

Upon motion it was ordered that 4 typewritten copies of the verdict be prepared and that 1000 copies be printed for distribution, the type written copies being given to the Courier Journal and the local newspapers.
