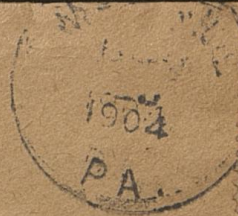

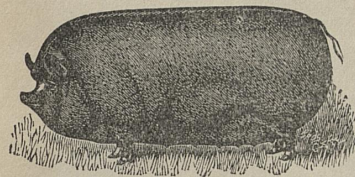

Dear Sir:

At the last annual meeting of the Association a resolution was adopted providing for the changing of the time and place of the annual meetings of the Association so that they could be held at Chicago, Ill., during the time of the International Live Stock Exposition. In order to make this change an amendment to the Constitution is necessary and a special meeting for the purpose of voting on the matter is called for Tuesday, Nov. 29, 1904, at the Live Stock Record Building, Union Stock Yards, Chicago, Ill., at 7 o'clock P. M.

It is thought that by having the annual meetings in Chicago it will be possible for a large number of our members to be present. Enclosed please find the proper legal forms of notice to amendment to the Constitution. A blank proxy is also enclosed. As an amendment to the Constitution requires an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members, if you cannot attend this special meeting, kindly sign the enclosed proxy in blank and return it to this office. It is understood that this proxy is to be used only for this meeting and covering the objects as outlined in the call, and you are invited to express your views in the matter and your instructions will be carried out.

At the above time and place the business usually transacted at the annual meeting will also be considered.

In spite of the general depression owing to the presidential year and a shortage of the corn crop in some sections of the country, the business of the American Berkshire Association for the last year has been very satisfactory and the reports of the officers will show a material increase over previous years.

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS.

The stockholders of the American Berkshire Association are hereby notified that a special meeting of said Association will be held at the Live Stock Record Building, Union Stock Yards, Chicago, Ill., on the 29th day of November, 1904, at 7 o'clock p. m., for the transaction of such business as might properly come before any regular meeting and to consider amendments to the Constitution of said Association to be voted upon as follows:

To change Article III, Section 2, so as to read as follows:

The Directors shall be divided into three classes, two of which shall be elected at each annual meeting to serve for the period of three years. Each year an election shall be held to fill such vacancy or vacancies in the directory as occur from expiration of term of either of the three classes or otherwise. Each certificate of stock entitles the holder thereof to one vote.

Add a section to Article III to read as follows:

Sec. 6. The Annual meeting of the Association shall be held at such time and at such place in the State of Illinois as may be fixed by the President and Secretary with the approval of a majority of the members of the Executive Committee, a notice of such meeting being sent to each member by the Secretary at least thirty days in advance thereof.

Said special meeting will be held at the time and place above named.

Black Knight 30,003, First prize 2 year-old and Champion Berkshire Boar any age, at the Columbian Exposition at Chicago in 1893. Also winner of seventeen other First and sweepstakes prizes in 1892 and 1894, at Des Moines, Lincoln, St. Joe, Kansas City, Peoria and Indianapolis—defeating every boar he ever met.

My herd of Berkshires won more than five hundred prizes in ten years at the best fairs in the country, winning the Silver Cup over all breeds at Des Moines in 1892, 1894 and 1895. The latter year there were 2584 head of swine on exhibition—the largest exhibit of swine ever made on a fair ground in the world.

At the World's Columbian Exposition, in Chicago, in 1893, I showed nine head of hogs, winning eleven cash prizes on them.

I was never beaten but once for pen of lambs, in all my showing.
