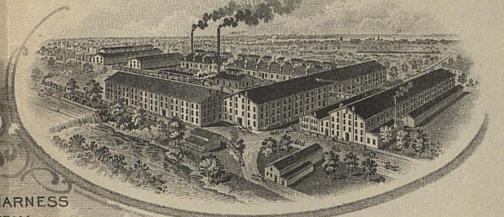


Friend Anderson:
