The port of Superior was established about 1863, under the headquarters port of Michilimackinac, Michigan, now known as Mackinac. Thereafter the headquarters was transferred first to Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, then to Marquette, Michigan, and finally, in 1911, to Duluth, Minnesota. In 1913 the headquarters name was changed to the District of Duluth-Superior, No. 36.

This port soon established its importance, and with the rapid industrial and commercial growth of the city of Superior, due to its location at a navigation head and proximity to the Northern mines and the great Western wheat area, the headquarters became one of the largest tonnage ports in the United States, second only to the port of New York. Since the greater part of the total tonnage for the Duluth-Superior district passed through Superior, its citizens felt that it should become the headquarters. There arose then, as a result, a controversy between Duluth and Superior for the headquarters office and its attendant personnel and prestige. In 1913 a committee from Superior went to Washington with a plan for a dual headquarters with alternating residency. The plan was adopted, but the result was only a nominal change, since the alternating residency was never put into practice. At the present date a joint resolution has been put before the legislature by Senator Melson, and adopted by both houses, asking that Superior be made a subport of the port of Milwaukee.

The duties of the Collector increased in degree and scope along with the growth of the port, so that as early as 1891 Collector E. Moran appealed to Washington for additional help and larger quarters. At one time or another the Collector, because of the lack of proper agents, was required to attend to such activities as the investigation of smuggling, both of opium and Chinamen, the presentation of evidence before the Court, the deportation of aliens, the handling of seamen's claims for hospitalization and medical aid, and the handling of applications for pensions made by Spanish American War veterans. The present function of the Collector is

limited to the collection of duties on imports.

The first Collectors conducted the Customs office along with their private business. Mr. Peter E. Bradshaw, appointed in 1883, conducted the office in conjunction with a fur trading post. Mr. L. W. Safford, between 1886 and 1880, conducted the office in his residence. It was not until 1891 that office space was probided by the Government, at which time a room was obtained in a building known as the Hammond Block. Finally, in 1908, the Federal Building was completed, with quarters for all Federal agencies.

Every five years a report of the records is made to congress and those are destroyed which it advises. Otherwise, since office room has been federally provided, no records have been sent to Washington. Those retained are kept in excellent condition.

With the establishment of the Internal Revenue Service, July 1, 1862, under the direction of a Commissioner, the country was divided into districts, with an Assessor and Collector for each. Six such Districts were established in Wisconsin, August 26, 1862, but they were finally merged into one district as a result of a series of consolidations: the Third with the Second, July 1, 1871; the Fourth with the Fifth to form a new Third, March 1, 1872; the Third with the First and the Sixth with the Second, July 1, 1887; and the First with the Second, August 1, 1919. The head-quarters of this Second District, located at Madison, served as the headquarters for the whole State of Wisconsin from August 1, 1919, until January 16, 1920, when it was transfered to Milwaukee, which had been the location of the headquarters for the First District. The official title for the district covering all of Wisconsin was changed to the District of Wisconsin June 1, 1920.

The Internal Revenue office in Milwaukee was housed in the Customhouse Building, 134 East Water Street (old address), from 1866 to 1899, at which time it moved to its present quarters in the Federal Building. With the establishment of this office as headquarters for the State, the records of the previously existing districts were moved to Milwaukee.

The office of the Collector makes periodic requests for permission from Washington to destroy certain records, enumerating

the particular records for which the authorization is requested. The records, however, are not necessarily destroyed immediately upon receipt of an authorization for destruction; some are retained at the discretion of the Collector, who may avail himself of the permission to destroy them any time after receipt of the authorization. Where destruction has already taken place, information as to that

fact is given in the particular serials.

The office sends many records to the Washington office, retaining duplicates in its own files. In a number of instances there is more than one copy of certain records in the local office, various sections of this office having been delegated to perform certain functions and having need of the same records in the course of their duties. The Administrative Section, performing the general administrative work of the Collector, maintains a general file on all matters pertaining to this work and on all personnel data. The issuing of tax stamps, the collection of moneys on the sales of such stamps and of the income tax and miscellaneous taxes, and the depositing of such collected moneys is handled by the Cashier and his assistants; the adjustment of claims, by the Claims Section; the accounting of the Cashier's transactions, by the Control Section; field investigations of tax matters, by the Field Section; and the auditing of income and miscellaneous tax returns, by the Income Tax and Miscellaneous Tax Audit Sections respectively. The tax on certain processed articles, effective from July 1933 to January 6, 1936, was in charge of a separate personnel, and a reduced staff has been retained to dispose of pending claims.

ALCOHOL TAX UNIT OFFICE OF INVESTIGATOR IN CHARGE Federal Bldg., 517 E. Wisconsin Ave.

Under the war-time National Prohibition Act, the Commissioner of Internal Revenue was in charge of the enforcement of the law, with the District Collectors issuing the permits for the legal liquor traffic. For the administration of the laws pursuant to the Eighteenth Amendment, there was established a separate unit in the Bureau of Internal Revenue under the direction of a Prohibition Commissioner, one branch of this Prohibition Unit administering the regulatory and police provisions, and another the permissive provisions. A Federal Prohibition Director for each state, assisted by a force of liquor inspectors, was put in charge of the permissive provisions, while the enforcement work was under the direction of District Supervising Agents with a mobile policing force of prohibition agents.

The office of Federal Prohibition Director for Wisconsin was established in 1920 and the enforcement service in 1921, with headquarters in Milwaukee. In 1922 the position of the Supervising Agent was abolished, and the permissive and enforcement work was combined under the Prohibition Directors in the states.

In 1925, the Washington office ordered the abolition of the offices of the State Prohibition Directors and provided for a district set-up, with a Prohibition Administrator in charge of each district. In accordance with this reorganization, the Eastern Division of Wisconsin was put in charge of a Federal Prohibition Deputy Administrator and was made a part of the district under the Federal Prohibition Administrator whose headquarters were in Chicago; the Western Division was in charge of another Deputy Administrator and was part of the District having headquarters in St. Paul. In 1927 the Prohibition Unit of the Bureau of Internal Revenue became an independent bureau, the district set-up continuing to function as before.

July 1930 witnessed a further change: establishment of a Bureau of Prohibition in the Department of Justice, to have charge of the work incident to the enforcement of the penal provisions of the prohibition legislation; joint action of the Secretary of the Treasury and the Attorney General in prescribing permit regulations; and the replacement of the Bureau of Prohibition of the Department of Treasury by a Bureau of Industrial Alcohol in the same department for the administration of the permissive features of the prohibition work. The Bureau of Prohibition of the Department of Justice assumed a district set-up, and the Wisconsin branch continued to be divided into an Eastern and Western Division with Deputy Administrators in charge of each, as under the Treasury Department, but both divisions were under the district having headquarters in Chicago. The Bureau of Industrial Alcohol had twelve districts in charge of Supervisors of Permits and branch offices of these districts in charge of Assistant Supervisors of Permits, the Wisconsin territory being placed under the district having headquarters in Chicago.

In August 1933 the Bureau of Prohibition of the Department of Justice was abolished and its functions were assumed by a Prohibition Unit of the Division of Investigation. With the change in the nature of the duties in the matter of liquor control, as a result of the Twenty-First Amendment, the Prohibition Unit was replaced by the Alcohol Beverage Unit of the Division of Investigation and the functions of the Bureau of Industrial Alcohol were transferred to the Bureau of Internal Revenue. Finally, in May 1934, the Alcohol Beverage Unit of the Division of Investigation was merged with the staff of the Bureau of Internal Revenue handling industrial alcohol matters to form the Alcohol Tax Unit of the Bureau of Internal Revenue, with Chicago as the headquarters of the district covering Illinois, Indiana, and Wisconsin. The Wisconsin branch office was established in August 1934.

Originally located in the Federal Building, the Federal Prohibition Director for Wisconsin had his office in the Gross Building, 174 W. Wisconsin Avenue, during 1924. With the inauguration of the district set-up, the important records were sent to the district headquarters. The Milwaukee office of the Alcohol Tax Unit has been located in the Federal Building since its inception. It is presumed that some records prior to 1934 have been destroyed under authority of an Act of Congress, but the Alcohol Tax Unit preserves all of its records except the work sheets, which are destroyed upon the final disposition of pending matters. Prior records are located in Chicago.

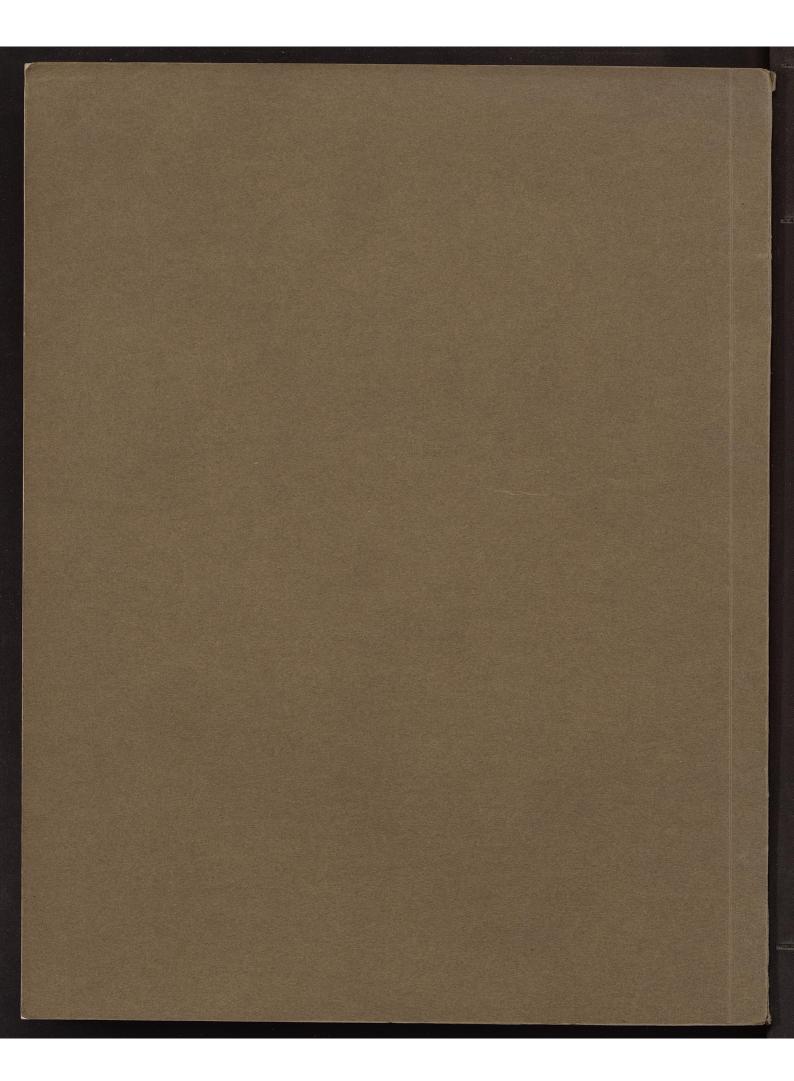

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PREFACE

The Inventory of Federal Archives in the States is one of the products of the work of the Survey of Federal Archives, which operated as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration from January 1, 1936 to June 30, 1937, and has been continued since that date as a unit of the Historical Records Survey, also operating as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration, and a group of state or local projects of that Administration.

The plan for the organization of the Inventory is as follows: Series I consists of reports on the administration of the Survey, acknowledgments, and general discussions of the location, condition, and content of federal archives in the states. Succeeding series contain the detailed information secured by workers of the Survey, in inventory form, a separate series number being assigned to each of the executive departments (except the Department of State) and other major units of the Federal Government. Within each series No. 1 is a general introduction to the field organization and records of the governmental agency concerned; the succeeding numbers contain the inventory proper, separate numbers being assigned to each state in alphabetical order. Thus, in each series, the inventory for Alabama is No. 2, that for Arizona No. 3, that for Arkansas No. 4, etc.

For each local office information regarding each series, or unit of related records, is presented in the following order: title, inclusive dates ("to date" indicating an open file at the time the information was secured), general description of informational content, description of the system of filing or indexing (if any), a statement of frequency and purpose of use, form of the record itself (bound volumes, sheets in folders, etc.), linear footage, description of the containers, physical condition of the records (not stated if satisfactory), location by room number or other identifying information, and finally, the number of the Form 58SA on which this information was originally recorded by a Survey worker and from which it was abstracted for the Inventory. This form is on file in The National Archives. When it contains substantial information on addenda sheets which has not been included in the mimeographed abstract, indication of this is given by use of the reference "See addenda."

In Wisconsin the work of the Survey was directed by Mr. J. E. Boell from its inception in 1936 until its termination on June 30, 1937. This inventory of the records of the Department of the Treasury in Wisconsin was prepared in the Madison office of the Survey and was edited before final typing by Dr. Erik Achorn of the Washington office. It is reproduced in mimeographed form through the facilities of the Historical Records Survey.

The wane of the lumber and logging industries reduced the number of vessels calling at Baileys Harbor. As a result of this condition this and the Coast Guard economy plan, this station was changed from a full complement station, employing 12 men and a commanding officer, to a two man station, on May 1, 1933. This station has responded to approximately 480 calls for assistance. The most spectacular call was the rescue of 15 men from the stranded steamer "Philotus Sawyer" October 27, 1916, where part of the crew were badly injured. The telephone system consists of many separate and distinct lines, each being a unit in itself. The maintenance and operation of these lines and the supervision over the personnel of the telephone force in the various divisions is delegated to the Division Commanders.

The Green Bay office is included in the Chicago Division of the Field Service. It has charge of all telephone communication work in Districts 10 and 11, which cover the units on the west shore of Lake Huron, the shores of Lake Superior, and the shores of Lake Michigan.

The office functions under the Division Commander. The Division Supervisor has complete supervision over the telephone personnel within the division. His duties consist of the following: filing of all records and correspondence pertaining to the telephone system; attention to all matters pertaining to construction, repair, maintenance, and operation of the telephone system; supervision of all contractual relations with commercial telephone companies; making of periodic reports to Washington; make annual inspections of telephone lines and other equipment; examination of station records and making certifications to warrant officers; vouchering message expenses in districts.

TWO RIVERS

COAST GUARD STATION
East St., Near West Twin River

The Two Rivers Life Saving Service was established in 1862 by the Women's National Relief Association, which was an organization for the relief of the shipwrecked. Two Rivers fast became a lake port, and the Federal Government designated this station as a U.S. Life Saving Station in 1878. For a long time, this station had no

power-driven boats, only those propelled by oars and sails, and until 1915 only the hardiest fishermen volunteered to operate the station. It progressed as the city progressed, and in 1909 five new buildings and a tower were erected. All records so designated are forwarded to the Eleventh District Headquarters at Green Bay, Wisconsin, and so-called useless papers are destroyed.

This station records and reports weather conditions to the Department of Agriculture, as an accommodation. It received no remuneration for this service, although at the beginning of this service the wife of the officer in charge received fifteen dollars per month. These reports and records are sent to Washington monthly. The station also performs some functions for the Collector of Customs at Milwaukee. They consist of the boarding of ships entering this harbor for the purpose of inspection as to compliance with maritime regulations. Quarterly reports of these inspections are sent to the office of the Collector of Customs at Milwaukee.

This office was established in 1852, under District 37 head-quarters port of Milwaukee, with Chas. E. Fitch acting as Deputy Collector. The tenure of Mr. Fitch is unknown, but in 1881 the office was held by Geo. Burnet, who was succeeded by the following: Fred Hinrichs, Atty. C. H. Sedgwick, Fred Schultz, and in 1916, E. J. Kellner, the present incumbent.

The office of Deputy Collector has always been held by men engaged in other business and its functions carried on simultaneously with the conduction of such business. Hence it is assumed that the records of this office were transferred at each change of Collector to the place of business of that Collector. Mr. Burnet was an employee of the First National Bank of Manitowoc, 208 North 8th Street; Mr. Hinrichs proprietor of the Hinrichs Drug Store, 724 York Street; Atty. Sedgwick conducted a law office in the Garrison Block, North 8th Street; Mr. Schultz conducted a business in the building which is not the Kellner Shoe Store. These buildings are all still in use. This information was gathered from a scrapbook of marine affairs compiled by Capt. Ed. Carus, Manitowoc, Wisconsin, and from Capt. Carus himself, who was personally acquainted with the Collectors mentioned with the exception of Mr. Fitch.

HEADQUARTERS PORT OFFICE OF COLLECTOR

(A) Appraiser's Stores Bldg., 628 E. Michigan St. (B) Federal Bldg., 517 E. Wisconsin Ave.

Established in 1850, this agency had quarters in the U. S. Courthouse and the old Customs House Building until 1898, when it moved to the Federal Building. In 1916, with the erection of the Appraiser's Stores Building, the division in charge of appraisement and examination has been located in this building. In addition, many old records have been stored in the Appraiser's Stores. Some records of this agency have been destroyed on official authorization, H. R. Report 1384, April 27, 1934, permitting the
