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May 11, 1915

The faculty met in the faculty room on Tuesday, May the eleventh, 1915, to complete the work left over from the meeting held on Friday, May the seventh, President Barker presiding. Quorum present.

President Barker announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider recommendations made by the Student Welfare Committee with reference to the Honor System. After a general discussion, the following recommendations were adopted:

(1). We recommend, therefore, that the General Faculty define the status of the student when under suspension; (2) that written notice shall be given by the Secretary or proper office to the Instructors in whose courses students have been found cheating and for which they have been suspended from the Institution; (3) that such students be not allowed credit in these courses unless they take such work over again; (4) that making the Honor System optional on the vote of the class is entirely contrary to the spirit of the System; (5) in as much as the Student Committee is powerless to enforce its decisions without the sanction of the General Faculty, we further recommend that any violation of the Honor System, or failure to abide by the decisions of the Honor Committee, shall be brought before the regular Committee on Discipline and that such violations shall render the guilty person liable to expulsion from the University; (6) that whereas it is desirable for members of the Faculty to report any evidence of cheating to the Student Committee for their consideration, and cooperate with the Student Committee in every way possible whenever called upon by the Committee to so assist them, yet no member of the Faculty should in any way interfere or participate in the operation of the Honor System except when expressly invited to do so.
