War winds down: Major battles over, **U.S.** official says

No last stand: Tikrit, Saddam's hometown, falls without the widespread resistance some feared

Saddam Hussein's hometown of Tikrit fell with unexpectedly light resistance on Monday, the last Iraqi city to succumb to overpowering U.S.led ground and air forces. A senior Pentagon general said "major combat engagements" are likely over in the 26-day

Pentagon officials disclosed plans to pull two aircraft carriers from the Persian Gulf. At the same time. Iraqi power brokers looked ahead to discussions on a postwar government at a U.S. arranged meeting set for Tuesday. "I would anticipate that the major combat engagements are over," Maj. Gen. Stanley McChrystal told reporters at the Pentagon. Tikrit fell with no sign of the ferocious last stand by Saddam loyalists that some military planners had feared. Secretary of State Colin Powell hinted at economic or diplomatic sanctions against Syria, saying the government is developing a weapons of mass destruction program and helping Iraqis flee the dying regime. Syrian officials denied the charges, Looting eased in Baghdad after days of plundering are government buildings, hospitals and an antiquities museum, and group of religious and civil opposition leaders met in the capital to plan efforts at renewing power, water security and other vital services. I raqi weaponry, French-mad migusin amounts of raqi weaponry, Prench-mad migusin cartridges and hundreds of paper files inside a Baath Party enclave as the dead regime began yielding its secrets. In Tikrit, about 90 miles north of Baghdad, "Three was less resistance than we anticipated." Brig. Gen. Vincent Brooks told reporters, as American ground troops moved into the city after days of punishing air strikes.

American forces captured a key Tigris River bridge in the heart of town and seized the presidential palace without a fight at shey rolled past abandoned Iraqi military equipment.

They set up checkpoints to keep prominent regime figures from leaving, and a line of armored vehicles was parked in front of a bazaar inside the city. The operation inside Tikrit, Brooks added, "is really the only significant combat action that occurred within the last 24 hours." McChrystal told reporters, "I think we will move into a phase where it (combat) is smaller, albeit sharp fights."

With Saddam and his two sons dead or in hiding, his regime gone and his armed forces routed, U.S. commanders took steps to reduce American firepower in the war zone.

A U.S. defense official said two of five aircraft carrier battlegroups in the region would soon be departing, the USS Kitty Hawk returning to its base in Japan and the USS Constellation to San Diego. Each carrier has about 80 warplanes, including F/A-18 and F-14 strike aircraft as well as surveillance and other support craft.

Taxpayers who procrasti-nated and now find them-selves up against Tuesday's filing deadline can get a four-month extension from the In-ternal Revenue Service by fil-ing a one-page form, no ques-tions asked.

an extension must pay their taxes by April 15 to avoid paying penalties. "My biggeset piece of ad"Wy biggeset piece of advice is that the extension is
only an extension to pay," said
Evan Snapper, senior manager with personal financial
counseling at Ernst & Young.
Taxpayers must make a
good faith effort to estimate
how much they owe when
they use form No. 4883 to file
for an extension, and they
must pay 90 percent of their
taxes owed for the year to
avoid penalties.

Taking a wild guess at the tax bill and pleading ignorance later may cause the IRS to revoke the extension.

"It's not going to work, not on April 15," Snapper said.

Late filers can take some comfort in the fact that they are not alone. The Internal Revenue Service expects more than 5 s million people to file for the automatic four-month extension. The number of people requesting more time has gradually crept up over the last two decades to more than 5 percent.

Viewers watch but do not live perils of war



It's in the small activities of every-day life that the sacrifices of war become hearthreakingly clear. The realization doesn't come with the bombast of network news updates, the grainy video transmission of journalists embedded with our soldiers on the Iraqi frontlines, or even with the images of missiles splintering into brilliant shards in the placid evening sky above Baghdad.

Rather, it comes with the routine completion of small tasks, the activities that fill up our lives quietly. Checking out at the grocery store, watching a soccer mom fill her SUV with superunleaded, methodically picking up a newspaper over coffee in the morning — these are the things that remain constant for Americans, even when we re in the midst of waging war. We live in one of the few countries where we can continue — and expect — to pick up our morning late at Starbucks while scanning the paper for the morning scombat body count.

Since the events of Sept. 11, Americans have become accustomed to the language of war. It's sobering to think it with the continuation of the state security threat (compliments of Ridge and Rumsfeld) and stocking up on duct tape and granola bars because, well … it's something, and it at least gives us the impression that we're not as passive and helpless as we really are.

But even as our troops are already merrily pulling down Saddam's graven images in Baghdad, it becomes disturbingly obvious that, for all the superficial changes that have occurred in the life of the average American, we still have no real, working comprehension of the horror of war. Hell, we're so dut of touch with the realities of death and destruction on a massive scale that we're willing to support a president who wages it prememptively, without concrete provocation. Hey, as long as it's them and not us, right?

For families in Baghdad, war is not abstract, nor is death; both have been a horrifying and immediate part of reality, even as they attempt to carry on some semblance of normal life. The Bush administration speaks of wanting to make Baghdad's streets safe for children to play, but what's the point if war eventually leaves no city or streets to play in?

One of the most difficult questions that Sept. 11 raised for Americans was, "Why do they hate us?" But we can never begin to answer it — let alone correct it — without a desire to see ourselves as world citizens, to understand and empathize with others, even when they don't look or pray or speak like us.

It goes beyond whether you support this war, a point too many in this country are willing to disregard. It touches upon concepts much more basic — those of humanity, compassion and of understanding.

You don't have to march in an anti-war protest to care what happens to the people of Iraq. You just have to appreciate that Iraqi lives are no more expendable because they call God by a different name — and that the capture of a dictator, no matter how cruel, is not worth the sacrifice of so many innocents.

While she and other protesters marched around with a giant inflatable pig and cardboard KKK members, the target of her protest. 


