

A. and M. College of Kentucky
December 9, 1898.

The faculty met in regular session in the President's room, in the College building 3:30 pm All present except Profs. Miller, Shackleford, and Mathews.

The minutes of several previous meeting were read and all were approved except the provision on page 1st that Mr. W.C. Brough be required to pass on history. To this provision Prof. Anderson objected. The chairman was not ^{Authoritatively} ^{Authoritative} ready to decide this matter, Mr. Brough is before Dr. S.

The communication of Mr. A.C. Fleckman relative to the degrees of A.B. or Ph.B. was referred to the classical faculty with power to act.

A communication from Mrs. F.E. Beauchamp relative to having young men excused from military drill twice a month to attend meetings of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union was referred to the commandant with power to act.

Prof. Miller reported that the Committee appointed to ascertain the general standing of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity, had found by investigation that the Fraternity has a large number of chapters in the South. That the committee recommended that permission be given to establish a chapter of said Fraternity in the State College. Report approved, Committee discharged.

On motion ordered that the students signing petition dated Nov 14, be permitted to establish a chapter of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity in the State College.

On motion ordered that the Secretary be instructed to furnish to the petitioners copy of all legislation of the faculty and Board relative to greek letter Fraternities

Prof White reported that the Committee on Courses had almost completed its work, and in a satisfactory manner, but that the committee would not ask to be discharged.

Prof White stated the case of a student who will almost if not entirely complete his course of study during this collegiate year and requested that in the event he fails to complete it he be allowed to do the unfinished work ^{amounting perhaps to one hour a day} next year; that at the same time he be permitted to do work leading to a masters degree; to enjoy the benefits of a fellowship; to be excused from military duty and practice.

On motion ordered that ^{the case of} A.B. who wishes to finish some work leading to a bachelor's degree and at the same time to do work leading to a master's degree and enjoy some or all of the benefits of a fellowship, be referred to the Board of Trustees for its consideration at the December meeting.

Prof Anderson chairman of the Committee on athletics reported as follows.

The committee handled all money collected by the association and gave permission to play all games with other teams. The regulation regarding the class-standing of the students was carried out except in one instance where a special concession was made. Only bona fide students were allowed to participate in games. The record of the foot ball team was excellent and by the continual supervision of the faculty over the details of athletic sports we believe that the present high standard will be maintained.

Ordered that each Instructor be allowed to conduct his examinations in his own way during his own recitation hours or after consultation with his immediate associates

Resolved that the faculty memorialize the Board of Trustees to suspend class marching during the remainder of this collegiate year
