Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 14, 1976.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met on Tuesday, December 14, 1976, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Professor Michael Adelstein, Mr. William R. Black, Mrs. Robert O. Clark, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, Mr. John R. Crockett, Mr. John R. Gaines, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mrs. David Hermansdorfer, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. Mike McLaughlin, Mr. Zirl Palmer, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer Ramsey, Professor Paul G. Sears, and Mr. James A. Sutherland. Dr. John R. Woodyard was absent from the meeting. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Stanley Wall, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, Jack C. Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Robert M. Drake, Special Assistant to the President; and Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel. Representatives of the various news media were also present.

A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m. and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Michael McLaughlin. Following the call of the roll, the secretary reported 18 members present and one member absent and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:15 o'clock.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on October 19, 1976 was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as written.

C. President's Report

President Singletary called attention to PR 1, his monthly report to the Trustees, and recommended that the report be received and ordered filed. Without objection it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

The items in PR 2, Recommendations of the President, being routine in nature and there being no questions, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey, and passed, PR 2 was approved as a whole and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

President Singletary explained that two names had inadvertently been omitted from the Fall 1976 list of candidates for degrees, which was the next item on the agenda, and recommended that authorization be given to add the names of Donald J. Luken and Judith Stephenson to that list. On motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Clay, and passed, it was so authorized.

The second item in PR 3 recommended extension of Jack B. Hall's leave of absence for special assignment with state government from January 3, 1977 to January 3, 1978. Mr. Hall is currently serving on Governor Carroll's staff in Frankfort and President Singletary recommended that the extension of his leave be approved. On motion by Mr. Cooper, seconded by Mr. Clay, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Candidates for Degrees - University System (PR 4)

President Singletary recommended that he be authorized to confer upon each individual named in the attachment to PR 4, plus the two names added to the list by the Board in an earlier action, the degree to which the individual is entitled upon certification by the Dean of Admissions and Registrar and approval by the University Senate that the individual has satisfactorily completed all requirements for the degree for which application has been made.

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Gorman, seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Budget Revisions for 1976-77 (PR 5)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed, the revisions in the 1976-77 Budget as recommended in PR 5 were authorized and approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 6)

Noting that the proposed amendments had been received and ordered tabled at the September 21, 1976 meeting of the Board of Trustees, President

Singletary recommended that they be removed from the table and approved. It was so moved by Mr. Crockett, seconded by Mrs. Clark, and passed without dissent. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Elimination of Registration Fee for University Evening Class Program (PR 7)

As a further step in the University's program of eliminating specialized fees and in compliance with Standard 9 of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, President Singletary recommended that the \$2.00 special registration fee charged for classes offered through the University Evening Class Program be eliminated.

On motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Palmer, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Approval "In Principle" of the Paducah Community College General Development Plan (PR 8)

Commenting that the General Development Plan for the Paducah Community College, which had been sent to the Board members prior to the meeting, was the twelfth such plan developed for the community colleges, President Singletary said the only action required of the Board was an endorsement "in principle" of the plan and recommended that this be done. On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Professor Sears, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Housing Recommendation (PR 9)

Both President Singletary and Mr. Blanton discussed the need for the University to provide additional housing for its students and the manner in which it was proposed that this need be met. It was emphasized that the funding for the 200 two-bedroom apartment units and the acquisition of three existing apartments would not be from state money but from the sale of revenue bonds that would be retired exclusively from housing revenue.

Professor Adelstein raised a question as to student involvement in the planning and whether married students could afford to pay the proposed rental of \$200 per month. Mr. McLaughlin asked where the three existing apartments were located. After Mr. Blanton had answered their questions satisfactorily, Mr. Frank Ramsey moved adoption of the resolution in PR 9, Mr. Cooper seconded his motion, and it passed without dissent. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Report of Results of Alumni Member Election (PR 10)

President Singletary reported that the three persons receiving the highest number of votes on the election for an alumni member of the Board of Trustees were Mr. Thomas P. Bell, Mr. William R. Black, and Mr. William M. Gant.

Mr. Sutherland moved that the report of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees as given by Dr. Singletary, be received and put to record, and that the Secretary be authorized to certify to the Governor the names of Mr. Bell, Mr. Black, and Mr. Gant from which list the Governor will appoint a successor to Mr. Black, whose term expires December 31, 1976. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed. (See PR 10 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Hearing Committee Report (HCR's 1 and 2)

Mr. Black, Chairman of the Board of Trustees Hearing Committee, reported that the committee had met to consider two cases. In the first case, that of Mr. Robert Arlett, whose contract of employment terminated at the end of the 1974-75 academic year, the Hearing Committee recommended (1) that the case not be re-heard by the Board of Trustees, and (2) that the Board take no action to reverse the previous decision regarding the renewal of Mr. Arlett's contract beyond the 1974-75 academic year. Mr. Black moved acceptance of the report. His motion was seconded by Mr. Palmer and passed without dissent.

The second case involved the petition of Mr. Thomas C. Knuckles, relative to his disability payments. The Hearing Committee recommended, and Mr. Black so moved, that the Board find that Mr. Knuckles has received disability payments in accordance with the established policies of the Board of Trustees and that the Board affirm the previous administration judgment made in this case. His motion was seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed without dissent. (See HCR's 1 and 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Investment Committee Report (ICR 1)

Mr. George W. Griffin, Chairman of the Investment Committee, reported that his committee had met with the University's investment advisors and was satisfied with the manner in which the investment program was being handled. He moved that the report on investments for the quarter ending September 30, 1976, be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey and passed without dissent. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Griffin, representing Mr. Clay, who had been unable to attend the meeting of the Finance Committee on the morning of December 14, moved that the Interim Financial Report for the period ending October 31, 1976, be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black, and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Easement (FCR 2)

Mr. Griffin explained that the Finance Committee had considered the request from the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department for an easement for roadway purposes across the University property on the Leestown Road and recommended that the easement be granted, and he so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Crockett and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Authorization for Incineration of Paid Bonds and Coupons (FCR 3)

Mr. Griffin moved that the recommendation in FCR 3 providing for the incineration of paid bonds and coupons be approved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Clay, and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Meeting Adjourned

After first asking the members to remain following the meeting in order to have a picture taken, Mr. Sturgill called for a motion for adjournment. The motion was duly made, seconded, and carried, and the meeting adjourned at 2:55 p.m.

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky which were received and tabled at the September 21, 1976 meeting of the Board of Trustees be removed from the table and approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change PART X-A (page 31) to read:

All appointments shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. An applicant for a position shall not be discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, ethnic origin, or political beliefs. Additionally, the University shall not discriminate against any applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the applicant for employment is qualified.

Members of the Board of Trustees, except those elected to the Board as faculty representatives or as a student representative, and relatives by blood or marriage of any member of the Board of Trustees, are ineligible for appointment to any position in the University. No relative by blood or marriage of the President or the vice presidents exercising Universitywide jurisdiction, shall be employed in a position which carries responsibility for a part of the academic program of the University. Waiver of the above regulations may be permitted by the Board of Trustees on a stated temporary basis, not to exceed two years, when it is otherwise impossible practicably to fill a position with a fully qualified person. The same individual shall not be eligible for reappointment under the terms of this exception unless approval is given by the Board of Trustees. No relative by blood or marriage of any administrative officer of the University, or of any member of the University faculty holding the rank of associate professor or higher, may be appointed to any position in the University over which the related officer or staff member exercises supervisory or line authority. Employment of persons related by blood or marriage within the same department or division must be approved specifically by the President. "Relatives by blood or marriage", as used above, includes parents and children, husbands and wives, brothers and sisters, brothers- and sisters-in-law, mothers- and fathers-in-law, uncles, aunts, nieces and nephews, and step relatives in the same relationships.

Background: This amendment will bring the University of Kentucky regulations or policy statements into compliance with Department of Labor regulations and K.R.S. 207.150 enacted by the 1976 General Assembly.

Second Amendment - Change the first paragraph of PART XII-A (page 45) to read:

Equal opportunities shall be provided for all persons throughout the University in recruitment, appointment, promotion, payment, training and other employment practices without regard to race, ethnic origin, sex, color, creed, religion, age or national origin. Additionally, the University shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant for employment is qualified.

<u>Background</u>: This amendment will bring the University of Kentucky regulations or policy statements into compliance with Department of Labor regulations and K.R.S. 207.150 enacted by the 1976 General Assembly.

Third Amendment - Change the first paragraph of PART VII-B-2 (pages 23a and 24) to read:

The Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research is chairman of the Graduate Faculty and the Graduate Council. Under the broad direction of the President and the Vice President for Academic Affairs, he provides general planning, guidance and review for all of the University's endeavors in graduate instruction and research. He bears responsibility for the total research activity of the University, including the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, and for the coordination of research and graduate education. He has direct responsibility for the interdisciplinary research institutes, except for those for which responsibility specifically has been delegated otherwise. He appoints associate members of the Graduate Faculty and recommends the appointment of regular members for the approval of the President. He recommends on the appointment, promotion and granting of tenure to faculty members who may be involved in research and graduate programs of the University. He also recommends on budgets as they may affect research and graduate programs.

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Fourth Amendment - Change the fifth paragraph of PART VII-A-1 (page 18) to read:

An institute is a unit established for the administration of interdisciplinary programs that are primarily research in nature. It is administratively responsible to the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research, unless the administrative responsibility specifically has been delegated otherwise. The chief administrative officer of an institute is a director.

<u>Background</u>: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Fifth Amendment - Change the sixth paragraph of PART VIII-A-3 (page 28) to read:

Search committees for directors of interdisciplinary institutes shall be appointed, after consultation with the Graduate Council, by the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research or other specific officer to whom administrative responsibility has been delegated [after consultation with the Graduate Council].

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Sixth Amendment - Change PART X-C-10 (page 42) to read:

[Regular full-time employees of the University are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program to a minimum of \$4,000 if their salaries are less than \$4,000 and \$5,000 if their salaries are in excess of \$4,000. The premium for this basic coverage is paid by the University. This insurance may be increased optionally to a total of approximately 1 1/2 the annual salary. In addition, all regular full-time employees are encouraged to participate in Basic Medical, Major Medical and accident insurance programs, which programs may also include dependents.]

Regular full-time faculty and staff who were employed by the University prior to their attaining age 60 are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program for \$5,000. This insurance may be increased optionally to a total of 1 1/2 or 2 times the employee's basic annual salary. The premium for the basic insurance is paid by the University whereas that for the optional increase in insurance is paid by the employee.

Regular full-time faculty and staff who were employed by the University after they had attained age 60 are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program for \$2,000, with the premium for this basic coverage being paid by the University. No optional increase in this insurance is permitted under the group insurance plan.

In addition, all regular full-time employees are encouraged to participate in the University's basic hospital-medical, major medical, and accident insurance programs which also may include coverage for dependents.

<u>Background</u>: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice.

Seventh Amendment - Change PART X-C-1.2 (page 42) to read:

[Faculty and certain administrators are covered by the Total Disability Insurance Program. This program provides income protection through insurance coverage with TIAA and supplemental benefits by the University. Effective July 1, 1970, all regular full-time employees, other than those covered by Civil Service, will be included in this program.]

Regular full-time faculty and staff, other than those covered by Civil Service, are covered by the Total Disability Insurance Program following the completion of one year of employment at the University. This program provides income protection through insurance coverage with TIAA and, in some cases, supplemental benefits by the University. The University pays the full cost of this program.

<u>Background</u>: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice.

HOUSING RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation: that the President be authorized to seek approval from the Council on Public Higher Education to construct 200 two-bedroom apartment units in the Shawneetown area at an approximate cost of \$5,200,000.00 and to acquire three existing apartments consisting of 34 units within the University's land use plan at a price not to exceed the appraised value.

Background: The Vice President for Business Affairs and his staff did a Housing Feasibility Study for the University of Kentucky. The conclusion of this Study was that there is a critical shortage of housing at the University of Kentucky for undergraduate and graduate students. Three recommendations were made; a) that the University construct 200 units of two-bedroom type housing in the Shawneetown area; b) that funds for the construction of these units would come from the sale of revenue bonds that would be retired exclusively from housing revenue; c) that of the 200 units 50 should be reserved for married students and the additional 150 units should be made available to the 600 single students who could be housed in them. Concurrent with the Study, various apartment units conveniently located to the campus within the land use plan were surveyed. Thirty-four apartment units have been offered for sale to the University and it is also the recommendation of the Vice President for Business Affairs that these apartments be acquired. The Hearing Committee met on May 4, 1976 to consider the case of Mr. Robert Arlett, a former faculty member at the Hazard Community College whose contract of employment terminated at the end of the 1974-75 academic year. The Committee heard testimony from Mr. Arlett, Dr. Clyde L. Lewis and Dr. J. Marvin Jolly. The transcript of this testimony, consisting of 133 pages, is available for inspection by any interested member of the Board.

Following the hearing on May 4, the Committee directed the taking of the deposition of Mr. John K. Brown, Mr. Arlett's Division Chairman at the time of the decision not to renew his contract. This deposition, consisting of 87 additional pages of testimony, was taken on May 12, 1976 with Mr. Arlett, his attorney Mr. Rose, and John Darsie, representing the University, in attendance. The deposition was then sent to the Committee for review.

Having considered all the matters presented at the hearing and the material contained in the deposition, the Committee recommends:

- That Mr. Arlett's case not be re-heard by the Board of Trustees, and
- 2. That the Board take no action to reverse the previous decision regarding the renewal of Mr. Arlett's contract beyond the 1974-75 academic year.

Mr. Knuckles, a faculty member at Jefferson Community College, became totally disabled in January of 1976. He thereafter began receiving disability payments from the University pursuant to the disability plan adopted by the Board of Trustees on September 19, 1967. (Under the plan, the University makes disability payments for the first six months of disability; thereafter, payments are continued by the disability insurance carrier.)

Mr. Knuckles complained of two matters:

- 1. He did not believe that the University should have deducted an amount equal to his social security benefits from its payment to him for the sixth month of his initial period of disability.
- 2. He asserted that his disability income should have been based upon what his salary would have been if he had continued in active service to July 1, 1976, rather than his salary as of January, 1976 when his application for total disability was made.

The Hearing Committee, having considered Mr. Knuckles' petition and the various documents relating to the establishment and implementation of the University Employee's Disability Plan, is of the opinion that Mr. Knuckles has received disability payments in accordance with the established policies of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and that the Board of Trustees should affirm the previous administrative judgments made in this case.
