"Syphilis" was the subject of Dr. W. B. Hamilton, assistant professor of hygiene, when he addressed members of the American Student Union at a meeting of that group Monday night in the Union building.

Tracing the methods of transmission of the disease, Doctor Hamilton stated that approximately 90 percent of the cases were contracted through intercourse. Only about one-tenth of one percent of the cases are from accidental contact with the doctor.
