The faculty met in regular monthly session in the President's room in the College building at 8:30 am. All present except Profs Anderson, Pryor, and Captain Swigert.

The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

"Resolved that no student shall be allowed to change his or her Course of study from one Department of the College to another until he or she shall have completed and passed a satisfactory examination on each subject hitherto studied in the Department with which he or she is a matriculate; and that no change of Courses be permitted during the current year"

Prof. Merincke reported that Miss Elizabeth King has completed <sup>all</sup> the work assigned her as Post-Graduate work except the work in Latin and asked whether she would be required to do a year's work in Latin as a minor study.

Ordered that the question be referred to the Classical faculty.

The question concerning Mr. H.C. Wilson's degree (A.B.) was referred to Prof. Neville,

Prof. Kastle called attention to the time for submitting theses for Master's Degrees. The sense of the faculty was that when a student submits a thesis to a competent member of the faculty thirty days before commencement the requisite conditions have been satisfied.

Ordered that "Excursions representing the A. and M. College in any wise or taken part in by students of this College shall not be so undertaken except by the consent of the President, and provided further, that the Mistress of this College or some one designated by her and acceptable to the President act as the Chaperon of the female students from this College."
