



Decision to revamp Freshman Weekend will benefit students

It's about time UK does something for all incoming students.

Or, in the words of Joseph Burch, acting vice chancellor for students affairs, "Help new students hit the ground running on the first day of school,"

The best way to introduce college newcomers to university life, particularly life at UK, is to put them in an atmosphere similar to the real thing.

The administration's decision to organize a mandatory orientation session will, for the first time, bring the entire treshman class together and prepare them for their years at UK.

That was one of the purposes of Freshman Weekend, but on a smaller scale. Lack of participation, though, sent administrators looking for an alternative: a 2½-day orien-

tation program.

Just because Freshman Weekend was disbanded doesn't mean it was a flop. Small groups provided for important individual attention that helped make students feel at

But the more students receiving such attention, the better off they, and therefore UK, will be.

Last year, an ad hoc committee was formed to look at the current orientation system. After nearly a semester of review, the committee called for a "true" orientation which would provide incoming students with information geared toward student development skills and success.

The best way to do this is to bring all new incoming students to campus a few days before classes begin and give them special treatment; introduce them to the people who run this University; show them the University; and make them feel at home at this University.

And while members of the Freshman Weekend student organization are understandably disappointed, the administration did what it had to do.

KRS 189.725 provides:

Every operator of a parking lot covered by the provisions of subsec-tion (a)shall post signs stating thereon that the parking lot is pri-vately owned and unauthorized vehi-cles will be towed away at the own-er's expense. (Emphasis added.)

Any owner or attendant of a privately owned parking lot may have removed from the lot any unauthorized vehicle parked and any person the statute does not greatly except operator of a parking lot or each statute does not give such statute or any third party such as a towing severy operator of a parking lot overed by the provisions of subsection (a) shall post signs stating thereon that the parking lot is privately owned and unauthorized vehicles will be towed away at the owner.

On July 21, 1983, an official opinion of the Kentucky attorney general's office was released, interpreting this statute. Ozone theories under question

NEW YORK — An unusual peak of solar activity may have caused the recent decline in the Earth's protective ozone layer, and the ozone may be returning now that the sun's activity has subsided, says a study to be published

The findings argue against the contention that depletion is due primarily to man-made chemicals, includ-ing the chlorofluorocarbons used as refrigerants and aerosol propellants

Interest in changes in the ozone level has intensified in recent months following the discovery of a pronounced de-pletion of ozone over Antarctica, suggesting that atmo-spheric ozone destruction may be more severe than pre-

Newly analyzed satellite observations show increases of up to 75 percent in nitrogen dioxide in the stratosphere be tween 1979 and 1984.

TEL AVIV, Israel — The priest searching for an Israeli who reportedly leaked Israeli nuclear secrets left the country vesterday without solving the mystery of his missing

Film shows Stalin terror, effects on Russia

MOSCOW — The cinematic shocker of the season is an allegory of Stalin terror and its effect 50 years later. It is believed to be the first Soviet film about the dictator's brutality and was delayed by censors for two years.

"I've never seen anything like it in my life," a middleaged Moscow woman said yesterday. "You can't say it's a good film, it's just stunning."

The movie is called "Pokayaniye" (Confession) and was made for television in Georgia, Stalin's native republic, It opened this month in Tbilist, capital of the republic, and a Western visitor said it was the talk of the town. MOSCOW - The cinematic shocker of the season is an

Americans in Hanoi for MIA talks


BANGKOK, Thailand — Four U.S. military specialists went to Hanoi yesterday for technical talks aimed at resolving the status of 1,786 Americans listed as missing in action from the Vietnam War, which ended in 1975.

The talks, the fourth round this year, had been set for Oct. 8, but were suddenly canceled by Vietnam with no explanation. The technical talks began in December 1982.

One U.S. goal in the talks is to secure an agreement on a second U.S.-Vietnamese excavation of a warplane crosh site to search for remains. Last year, the first joint dig produced wreckage of a U.S. B-52 bomber and bone fragments. It was regarded as a milestone in the MIA search effort.
