I hope the winter is not as cold as the summer was hot. That is all I can think to write this time.

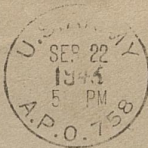
I would like for you to send me some of your picture but do not send me some of your old picture I would some new one.

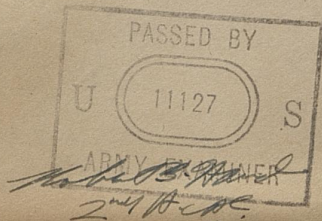

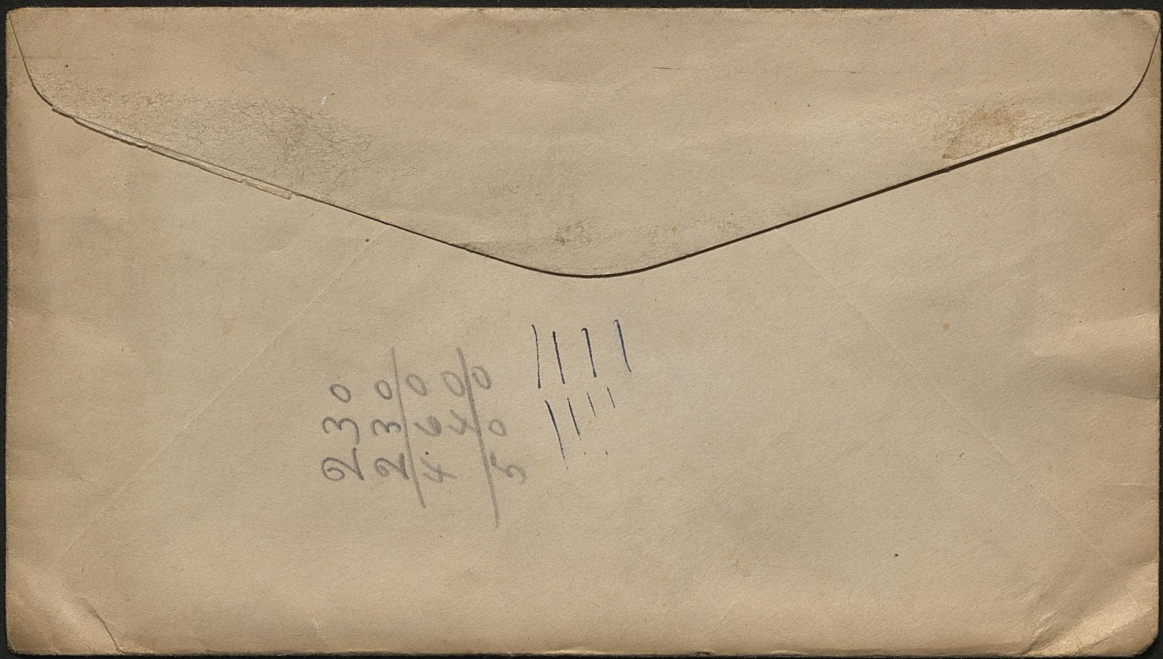
