During the fall semester, black enrollment was eight percent in schools in the Kentucky Community and Technical College System, which includes 62 schools that are open or under construction in 16 districts.

LCC staff and officials

say they are doing all they can to retain and graduate minority students once they enroll. Hartsfield said he is putting more effort into networking and graduating minority students.
"I work closely with the UK Office of Minority Affairs, as well as groups at EKU, Kentucky State and Louisville," he said.

Students are not the only group growing more diverse

Students are not the only group growing more diverse at LCC. Hiring faculty with diverse backgrounds also has a high priority, Kerley said. He said the members of the LCC faculty and professional staffs are about 20 percent African-American. These figures exceed the set goals of three percent for faculty and a little less than five percent for other staff.

AGHIDAD, Iraq — The U.S. bombing of an upscale neighborhood where Saddam Hussein and top aides were believed to be meeting blasted a 60-foordeep crater, ripped orange trees from their roots and left a heap of concrete, mangled iron rods and shredded furniture and clothes.

At least three buildings were destroyed in Monday's 2 pm. attack on the western Baghdad district of al-Mansour, which broke windows and doors as far as 300 yards from the site.

Rescue workers looking in the rubble for victims said two bodies had been recovered and the death toil could be as high as 14. They didn't release any names.

Those close to Saddam have said the Iraqi leader is so obsessed with security that very few people would know about his movements. He maintains dozens of residences and uses doubles to keep people guessing.

An exiled dissident told The Associated Press that only two people are kept posted about Saddam's whereabouts—his son Qusai, who commands the Republican Guard and heads the president's security, and his private secretary. Abed Hameed Hmoud, a member of Saddam's Tikriti clan.



Mystery illness: Some say epidemic leveling off

WASHINGTON — The number of people infected by the mysterious flu-like libes dubbed SARS is beginning to stabilize, a top Bush administration official said Monday, even as other health officials cautioned that the international epidemic could continue to spread.

In an interview with The Associated Press, Hauer added that it's too early to de-clare victory. The numbers continue to creep up for severe acute respiratory syndrome. Worldwide, more than 2.000 people have been sickened, and the death toll hit 100 on Mondar There are now 148 U.S. cases in 30 states with no deaths.

"I think we've started to stabilize in the number of cases. We're not seeing these large jumps every day," said Jerry Hauer, acting assistant secretary for public health preparedness at the Depart

sick with a more common bug. And he said officials are baffled as to why U.S. pa-tients are less sick than those in Canada, where SARS has forced thousands of people in Toronto to be quarantined and has killed 10.

"It might be that some of these folks in Canada just got more of the virus, were in closer contact," he said. "Any theory I give you at this point in time would just be a theory."

Testifying before a congressional committee. top health officials cautioned that things may get worse.
"This has very quickly become an international epidemic," Dr. Julie Gerberding, director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, told the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee. We don't know where this is going to go. We have to be prepared for

this to continue to spread."
Officials believe the virus originated in Guangdong, a southern province of China, where respiratory illnesses often start and spread. Chinese officials kept news of the disease secret for months, allowing SARS to spread before international health authorities could begin to fight it.

Hauer hopes that will

Hauer hopes that will change if international experts are stationed there permanently.

Just Monday, Chinese of-ficials reported that the disease had spread farther than they initially reported. State television reported one SARS death each in the provinces of Shanxi in the north, Sichuan in the west and Human in central China — the first reported fatalities in those areas and an indication the disease was more widespread than previously acknowledged.







Message to Athletics: Listen to the voters

UK students have spoken, and they're tired of spending Monday nights in Memorial Coliseum. A referendum on the Student Government election ballot last week surveyed whether students supported an online ticket lottery. Twice as many students, 1,714, voted in favor of an on-line system compared with the 875 who voted in favor of the current system.

Now UK athletics officials should heed the

Now UK athletics officials should heed the students' wish. "We wanted to get the student opinion (anyway)," said Joe Sharpe, UK Assistant Athletic Director who directs ticket sales. "Definitely, we want to help out the students as much as we can." Let's hope Sharpe and athletics administrators keep their word.

Lottery goers nowadays have to wait for hours on end at Memorial for tickets they're aren't totally guaranteed of getting.

It is hard to identify anything the athletics department actually stands to gain by creating

department actually stands to gain by creating an online lottery system other than improving its public relations with the student body. The system could be costly and it might take

significant research to determine the best way to make it work. It will have to accommodate group seating and must include an efficient poli-

cy for picking up and paying for tickets.

It is certain that making this kind of devo-tion to reinvent the lottery system would be more difficult than just paying a few athletics

employees a few hours overtime Monday night to oversee the current Coliseum lottery. Several students who opposed the lottery in last week's referendum vote said they did so be-cause the online system might be based on a lovalty system. This system rewards students

loyalty system. This system rewards students with the most loyalty points to get the best tickets first, unlike the current lottery that is selected completely randomly.

But Sharpe said the loyalty system would only be used in special circumstances like if UK was to participate in neutral court tournaments away from Lexington during the season.

The system should be created. The students want it, and the athletics department can show it cares about its cheering section.






