The measure would broaden the definition of a
human being in state law to include an unborn
child from the time of fertilization onward,

Bush warns 'axis of evil' nations WASHINGTON — The United States will watch closely to see what Iraq, Iran and North Korea do next, Defense Secretary Donald H. Kumsfeld warned Wednesday, a day after President Bush singled them out as part of a dangerous "axis of evil." Bush is weighing whether to escalate actions against Iraq beyond the current sanctions and fighter jet patrols. He also wants to stop Iran from funneling arms to terrorists, and seeks to prevent North Korea from developing and selling missiles. But no milliary action is minent, aides said. Senior White House officials said the administration is still rying to figure out how to deal with Iraq. The State Department also made clear its willingness to hold talks with Iran and North Korea, and to continue to press for weapons inspectors in Iraq.

WASHINGTON — Amid signs the worst of
the recession may be over, the Federal Reserve
left a key interest rate unchanged Wednesday,
ending a yearlong stretch of uninterrupted credit
easing. After 11 consecutive rate reductions last
year, Fed Chairman Alan Greenspan and his colleagues opted to keep the federal funds rate — the
interest that banks charge each other on
overnight loans — at 1.75 percent, the lowest levelin 40 years. The decision was announced after
a two-day closed-door meeting. On Wall Street,
stocks rallied. The Dow Jones industrial average,
based on preliminary calculations, closed up
144.62 points at 9.762.86, with the index gaining
back part of Tuesday's big loss.

New threat sent for kidnapped reporter ISLAMABAD. Pakistan — An email purportedly sent Wednesday by kidnappers of Wal Street Journal reporter Daniel Pearl threatened to kill him within 24 hours and warned American journalists to leave Pakistan within three days or "be targeted." The unsigned e-mail claimed that Pearl, who disappeared in Karachi on Jan. 23, was an agent of the Israeli intelligence service, the Mossad. "Therefore, we will execute him within 24 hours unless Amreeka (America) fullisour demands," the threatening e-mail said. It accused U.S. journalists of working for intelligence agencies and warned "all Amreekan journalists" to leave Pakistan within three days.



Suicide bomber wounds Israeli agents

Give rank system higher standards

UK moved up two spots in national rankings in past year for research, but university should focus on other areas

We all know of UK's much-touted goal of being a top-20 research institution by 2020. Many are skeptical about the feasibility of such an objective, since the schools we're up against have long standing traditions of general research-related excellence, not to mention enormous private endowments that help finance the university's extensive re-search efforts. And, unfortunately, it can be said of grant-giving that big names equal big backers.

The National Science Foundation announced last week that UK has moved up two spots in the national rankings in the past year. We are now the 47th best research university in America — among both private and public schools — and have spent more than \$200 million last year to get there.

There's a slight problem with this. This NSF ranking is based solely on the dollar amount UK spends per year on research against that of other universities. This includes state funds, departmental operating budgets, university monies and national grants. When you take into account the amount spent on national grant-funded studies, we're only 75th in the country.

National grants are extremely competitive and won only after a committee of experts decides that the person requesting the grant will be able to do good research. Based on the spent of the presence of the spents of the spents of the presence of the spents of the spents

Basically, studies funded by grants are generally of high quality, whereas other research could be rather suspect and still win support. So, in the quality indicators of research, we're considerably below top-20 status. The state and university of Kentucky have simply poured lots of money into anything titled "research" to increase our standing in the highly superficial dollar-amount bottom-line NSF ranking.

There are other issues at stake here, too. With this emphasis on research, how will undergraduate teaching be affected? The state has given UK \$866 million over the next 10 years to be sener solly on research. Will it be awayed to perpraised studies or

10 years to be spent solely on research. Will it be awarded to peer-reviewed studies or

anything anyone in a given department feels like studying?

The standards may be somewhat desultory, but kudos to UK's students, faculty and staff nonetheless for climbing the research rankings ladder and making our university look prestigious.

Covering up nude statues plain ignorant

Usually, I would be among the last to criticize a move by a member of the Bush administration. I have pretty much ignored the allegations of civil rights violations of alleged terrorists captured both in the United States and abroad. On Monday, a Justice Department spokeswoman said that partially nude statues in the Department of Justice gallery have been concealed by curtains at a cost of \$8,000. Apparently John Ashcroft was offended that his picture was taken in the gallery with the statues in the background.

I have tried to rationalize why the Department of Justice would spend \$8,000 to conceal these statues, but only one word weeps coming to mind: ignorance.

First of all, these statues are at all pornographic. They are the state of the state

I, for one, am offended by a painting of the Virgin Mary that is covered by manure, even though I am not a Catholic. However, I am not willing to say that the painting should be banned simply because I am offended by it.

Similarly, I have to ask: Why should these statues be concealed? Not only have they and other works of this nature been around for centuries, but these particular statues have also been in the same gallery in the Department of Justice since the 1808. They have seen conserved the same of the same salery in the Department of Justice with the same salery in the Department of these statues cost \$8,000 on government that tells us it cannot afford a fiscal stimulus bill, but it also potentially starts a dangerous trend within the Ashcroft Justice Department. Concealing statues within the halls of the Department of Justice is one thing, but going after artwork outside the Justice Department is another. I hope that Ashcroft does not risk his current popularity by going on a campaing for censorship.

The American people, who have grown more and more ond of Ashcroft since Sept. 11, certainly would not accept this. In justifying the Department of Justice decision to conceal testatues, Ashcroft spoksowoman says he did not know that the pictures of him showing the statues in the background were being taken. "He did not know this was being done," she said.

"The Attorney General has more important things to worry about than what appears in pictures."

Neighborhood's history thrives in Pralltown



Don't judge a book by its cover.

A UK student was assaulted Monday across from campus on Prall Street. The following day the Kernel ran a story in which he was quoted as describing the meighborhood. Pralltown, as shady. What of the meighborhood the pranter was no excuse for the victim to be attacked. Lexington's oldest black neighborhood, Pralltown, shares the same anniversary as the university as to when the doors first opened in 1865. Living in Lexington for a while now but not a native to the black communities here, I've heard some wonderful stories about Pralltown, a close-knit neighborhood.

As a community that fell to neglect in the 1960s and 70s because of urban renewal and younger residents moving to newer neighborhoods. Pralltown has seen a wave in the proposed of the city.

Now there are around 60 homes, which is less than half of the original. Houses used to be where the Lexing-

ton Theological Seminary exists today. After the urban renewal phase, trash, junk and weeds were occupying empty lots, mach handly favored new development.

In the last decade, Community Ventures, Inc., a nonprofit economic development organization, and Pralltown
resident Bill Brigham, president of Pralltown Development Corp., were instrumental in revitalizing the community and building beautiful new affordable homes there.
The revitalization brought younger families to the community after their many years of absence.
Pralltown is also the home of well-known celebrities.
Former Pralltown resident Lou Johnson made his
fame in baseball.
Now living in Los Angeles, Johnson, also known as
"Sweet Lou," started playing baseball for the Negro
League team, the Indianapolis Clowns and later worked
his way up in the Major League farm teams.
Eventually making it up to the majors, Johnson was a

his way up in the Major League farm teams.
Because he made local history as the first black Major
League player from Lexington, a neighborhood park and
baseball little league bear Johnson's name.
Ru Paul is nothing new to Lexington.

of Lexington's most colorful characters of the time, James Herndon. That was his birth name, though most knew him as "Sweet Evening Breeze." He often wore make-up and occasionally performed or appeared downtown in drag.

UK Athletics drops the ball

Out of town: Departues of UK athletes in recent years plagues Athletics Department, coaches of basketball and football teams

Marvin Stone's transfer to Louisville is disappointing, but not simply because a wasted talent in the state's most beloved sport escaped to UK's archrival.

Stone's transfer is a disturbing trend that goes back at least two years and as far back as coach Tubby Smith's second season at UK.

The mass exodus of UK recruits began with former guard Myron Anthony's transfer 10cember of 1988. Five months later fellow sophomores and former lick Pitino recruits Michael Bradley and Ryan Hogan were announcing their intentions to leave UK.

Less than three years later the count has grown to seven players who have left the team for various reasons. Most had differences of opinion with the coaching staff under Smith, by whom they were not recruited. Others, like Todd Tackett and Nate Knight, left the team to purson ther aspirations (Tackett opdet to play baseball and Knight more).

But Smith and his staff are not to totally blame. The mass departures are not limited to UK's most spiritual of sports.

In the same time period, the UK women's basketball team has had at least nine players leave coach Bernadette Mattox's squad. All nine players left between the end of the 1989-2000 season and last month.

Last season Mattox only returned three letter-winners and four players from a disappointing 15-14 team that finished eighth in the Southeastern Conference. Four players reproduces season. Altvine Mengdeng was a high school All-

American, but transferred to North Carolina State because of a lack of playing time. Stephanie Stoglin also left because of declining minutes and point guard Dawsieka Hawthorne left the team to return to her home in Mississippi.

Ultimately, all decisions to transfer come down to a realization that expectations, whether that of the coach or the player, cannot achieved. Unfortunately, most of these expectations.
