Dear Sirs;

After a complete analysis of the stomach  
sent me not a trace either of vegetable  
or mineral poison was discovered.

The only morbid appearance seen  
was redness of the lining membrane  
of the maw along the smaller curvature,  
and at this <sup>point</sup> studded thickly were  
the worms known as bott-worms  
adhering so firmly as to require  
some force to detach them. These  
worms were very numerous also  
at the oesophageal end of the stomach  
i.e. at the junction of the gullet  
& maw.
