

LOUISVILLE — Artificial heart surgeons and cardiac specialists from North America and Europe will talk about their experiments with the mechanical devices at a Louis-

Humana Inc., which is underwriting Dr. William DeV-ries' Jarvik-7 implants in Louisville, is sponsoring the ses-sions in the Humana Conference on Heart Replacement.

Besides DeVries, speakers will include Jack Copeland of the University of Arizona, who has used Jarvik hearts in two patients and who implanted an untested device in a

dying patient.

Lyle Joyce, who assisted DeVries in his first permanent implant in Seattle dentist Barney Clark, will tell about his use of the Jarvik-70 smaller version, designed for female patients.

Carbide appeals OSHA allegations

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — Union Carbide Corp. yesterday appealed all 221 citations filed against it by federal regulators, saying claims that its Institute plant is unsafe are "grossly distorted."

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration on April I levied a record \$1,37 million in fines against Union Carbide. Of the 221 citations at Institute, inspectors said 130 were for "willful violations" of federal law.

U.S. Labor Secretary William Brock also accused Union Carbide of using employees to "detect the presence of deadly gas by sniffing the air after alarms indicated a leak."

Yesterday was the troubled chemical company's final day to appeal the fines, which were assessed after OSHA investigators completed a walt-to-walt inspection of five of the plant's 18 units. No date has been set for the inspection of the remaining units.

Supreme Court rules on obscenity

WASHINGTON — Police seizing allegedly obscene materials from dealers do not have to provide special proof before getting court authority, the Supreme Court ruled

yesterday.

By a 6-3 vote, the justices said the same standards apply when police seek court warrants to seize allegedly obscene materials as in cases where police seek to seize illegal drugs or weapons.

The ruling means videocassetes seized from a store in Depew, N.Y., in 1983 may be used as evidence in an obscenity prosecution.

A sheriff's deputy took the films, with such titles as "Debbie Does Dallas," "Deep Throat" and "Little Girls Blue," from Network Video.



The store owners were charged with violating the state's obscenity law but the New York Court of Appeals threw out the prosecution. It ruled that the affidavits used to obtain a court warrant authorizing the seizure described nu-merous sex acts in the films but did not establish "probacause" to believe the films were obscene. Led by Justice William H. Rehnquist, the Supreme

Led by Justice William H. Rehnquist, the Supreme Court, today said the state court was wrong.

Rehnquist said the state court, without saying so specifically, required police officers to meet some higher standard of proof than the usual "probable cause" test before obtaining court warrants in cases of alleged obscenity.


