NATION AIDS virus fought off by 5-year-old patient

NEW YORK — A Los Angeles boy who was infected with the AIDS virus at birth apparently flought off the infection and is virus-free at age 5, astonishing his doctors.

Dr. Yvonne J. Bryson, a pediatrician and AIDS specialist at the UCLA School of Medicine in Los Angeles, said she believes it is the first carefully documented case of someone casting off all signs.

Tests proved conclusively that the by was infected for at least a month during the first two months of his life. Later examinations found no sign of the virus, Bryson said.

Doctors have no explanation and Bryson said she and her colleagues are studying the boy's immune system for clues that could be used to stop AIDS infections in others.

House rejects term limits amendment

House rejects term limits amendment
WASHINGTON — In an unvarnished setback
for the "Contract With America," the House last
night rejected a constitutional amendment placing
term limits on lawmakers.
"This issue is not going to go away," pledged
Speaker Newt Gingrich.
The vote was 227-204 on the proposal to limit
lawmakers to 12 years' service in the House or
Senate. That was more than 60 shy of the twothirds majority necessary for passage.
The vote capped a long day of debate that produced expressions of profoundly differing views of
government.
Freshman Rep. David McIntosh, R-Ind., noted
the maxim that "power corrupts," and said he and
other newly installed lawmakers must guard
"against the possibility that this new majority
would be corrupted by this power."
But Rep. Barney Frank, an eighth-term Democrat from Massachusetts, opposed the measure. "I
believe in representative democracy untrammeled,
unrestricted, unrestrained," he said. "Democracy
is not simply what a given majority in a public
opinion poll thinks at a given might in a public

MURRAY, Ky. — A 20-year-old Murray State University cheerleader who was injured in an accident that caused fatal injuries to another cheerleader was released from the hospital on yesterday, the school announced. Hopkinsville was the only cheerleader still hospitalized following the March 18 accident on Interstate 24 near Cadiz. Meacham had been hospitalized at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, Tenn.

Twelve cheerleaders and their sponsor were injured in the accident. The wreck occurred as they were returning from Nashville where they had flown from Tallahassee, Flas, following Murray State's appearance in the NCAA basketball tournament.

Pollitt's death

inspires fund

The tragedy of losing a student to domestic vio-lence has inspired the College of Education to estab-lish a scholarship fund in her memory. Last week education senior Chandra Pollitt, 22, and her sister Sally Steffey, 29, were killed by Pol-litt's ex-boyfriend, Adam Miller, 21, who then turned the gun on himself. Pollitt worked in the office of the dean of the Col-lege of Education for two years and recently had been accepted to UK's secondary social studies teacher education program. College of Education Dean J. John Harris said the scholarship was established 'so her memory can live on for those who are in similar circumstances," he added. "Chandra was working her way through col-lege."

Harris said every weekend Pollitt would return to her mother's in Ripley, Ohio, to work at her family's skating rink.

"The scholarship is a tribute to Chandra," said Jonathan Prase, a staff assistant in the College of Education. Onlege is soliciting contribution of the property of the scholarship will be awarded have not been established, the college already has discussed a few requirements.

Her said the scholarship will be awarded to a student who wants to teach in the public school system. Harris said Pollitt was planning to teach low income students in New York's inner-city after she graduated.

Just before her death, she had discussed the danger of teaching in New York. After the incident Harris was quoted as saying, "One of the last things we discussed was the danger of her going to New York to teach right after she graduated."

The recipient also would have to be a student admitted to the teacher education program, Harris said. Pollit had been admitted to the program just days before she died.

After Pollitt's death, Yvette Ray, who worked in the dean's office with Pollitt, said, "She was very excited about being admitted to the program."

"We are working with her family to establish other criteria (for the scholarship)," Harris said.

Court: Brown unfair to women athletes

PROVIDENCE, R.I. — Brown University dis-criminates against female athletes because far fewer women than men participate in college sports, i judge ruled yesterday in a decision that could force schools nationwide to revamp athletic programs. U.S. District Judge Raymond Pettine gave Brown 120 days to come up with a plan to comply with Title IX, the 1972 federal law prohibiting sex discrimination at schools that receive federal money.

Observation of the control of the co

craimes brown had violated the Title LX requirement that schools offer equal athletic opportunities to men and women.

"At Brown, far more male athletes are being supported at the university-funded varsity level than are female athletes, and thus, women receive less benefit from their intercollegiate varsity program as a whole than do men," Pettine rule.

University officials said they will appeal.

"This is a major victory for women across the country," said Lynette Labinger, lead attorney for the female athletes.

"This ruling should serve as a wake-up call to universities around the country that they better start complying with the law or face a court order to do so."

During the trial last December, Brown lawyer Walter Connolly had warned that if the school lost, universities across the country would be forced to cut men's athletic teams.
