Coughing up money: Doctors say syrup may be ineffective

Sick: Some say cough medicine helps treat symptoms

Cough syrup desen't work, according to one member of the largest medical society in the United States.

With modern say a "total waste of money" said Vincenza Snow, senior medical associate at the American College of Physicians-American Society of Internal Medicine.

"People start taking these medications ... at about the time when they really can't stand it anymore, which is about the time they would start feeling better anyway." Vincenza saids headded that this can then lead to the patient mistakensy associating improvements with the medicine they took. Cough syrup's ingredients include suppressants to stifle a cough and expectorants make it easier to cough up phiegm.

There's an extra shiver in their skip this time of year.

There's an extra shiver in their bushy tails skip around campus during this latest snap of cold weather.

What do UK's signature squirrels do in the winter?

They stay here and try to survive, according to experts.

"When it's really cold, they just stay in their nests in the hollows of trees," said Jim Krupa, a biology faculty member. Squirrel deaths also explain their winter absence.

"They have a 50 percent mortality rate this time of year," said Tom Barnes, an extension wildlife specialist and professor.

Hawks, cats, hurders and analysis.

Hawks, cats, hunters and cars kill many of them, he said.

But the trees on campus help them survive.

"UK has an ideal squirrel habitat with large trees that are
lightly scattered, which produce nuts," Barnes said.

When winter hits, they take cover in these trees, in hollows
and nests made out of balls of dead leaves.

The population of squirrels will soon begin to rise.

Iraq agrees to U.N. surveillance flights

Iraq agrees to U.N. surveillance flights

BAGHDAD, Iraq — Iraq agreed Monday to allow U.2 surveillance flights over its territory, meeting a key demand by U.N. inspectors searching for banned weapons as European opposition to American military action mount-defended by the season of the season as too little, too late. "This is a man who is trying to stall for time," he said after a meeting with Australian Prime Minister John Howard, a staunch U.S. aly against Iraq. "The reason we need to fiy U.2 flights is they're not disarming." Iraq is acceptance of the U.2 flights, as well as its submission of new documents to the United Nations over the weekend, marked Baghdad's latest step to stave off a U.S.-led attack and convince other governments that it was now ready to cooperate in full with U.N. inspectors key European governments insist that Iraq's cooperation is sufficient to allow inspections to continue and delay military action. On Monday France, Germany and Belgium vetoed a U.S.-backed measure to authorize NATO to make plans to protect Turkey in the event of attack by Iraq.



Daniel Kisling Jr. and Sgt. Plan can improve lottery efficiency

If you attended the most recent basketball lottery Feb. 3, you were likely approached by a member of Student Government and asked to sign a petition. Recently, two SG senators-atlarge proposed a referendum that would establish an online basketball ticket lottery system. Rachel Watts and Matt Rippetoe are offering to give students the option to vote on the issue in the SG spring elections. the SG spring elections.

Currently, in order to participate in the ticket lottery, students must go to Memorial Coliseum on certain Monday nights. These events often last well into the morning hours, which causes many students to leave early without receiving a

many students to leave early without receiving a ticket.

Under the online system, students would register for the lottery, and if they are chosen to receive a ticket, they could pick it up at the ticket office. This would save students the time and trouble of making a special trip to Memorial Coliseum. It would also keep many from returning home disappointed after not receiving a ticket.

Obviously, the current system is no good for

students who work on weekday nights. Also, stu dents who have early classes or exams to pre

dents who have early classes of exams to pre-pare for might be hesitant to attend the lotteries, knowing it could last for more than three hours. There are some concerns with the online sys-tem, though. For instance, how will the system know some students will want to sit together at games? Also, some would say an online lottery would take away from the college community experience, where thousands of students meet and socialize while waiting for their group to be

Before such a system is implemented, a model should be developed so students can see for themselves whether they would prefer the current system or the proposed online system. This
