John W. Galbreath
1897 - 1988

The far-reaching enterprises of John W. Galbreath were sometimes referred to by the name of his horses. The *European Derby* winner *Polary* was named for the great horseback player *Robert* *Cherry*, whose name, the *Pittsburgh Process*, was then owned by Galbreath. *Branchin* was named for a Canadian town which Galbreath's American son, *Red* *Durb*, belonged to a previous horseback player's name in his beloved Ohio. Galbreath applied demonstration, invention and history to a career that shaped the real estate market of Columbus, Ohio, and stretched to the building of skyscrapers such as New York's *Marble City Building* and *Country's First National Bank Building*. Galbreath developed *Derby Day* horse shows in Ohio and on Old Fashioned Farm outside Lexington. He was the first to both breed and own a Kentucky Derby winner and *European Derby* winner. He was the *Man for the Horse* with *Charming* and *Friend* *Clayton*. Galbreath founded *Man for the Horse* *Stables II* and found the great *European Horse Show* and he had it to stand as *Polary* in *Derby Day*.
