I. Ash Fork, Arizona, is discontinued as a repair station; to date May 19, 1887. [3559, Sig., 1887.]

II. Titusville, Florida, is announced as a station for the display of cold-wave signals; to take effect July 1, 1887. [3753, Sig., 1887.]

III. Frankfort, Kentucky, will be established as a special river station, Cincinnati section (Cincinnati, Ohio, centre); to take effect July 1, 1887. [3660, Sig., 1887.]

IV. Lexington, Kentucky, and Springfield, Missouri, will be established as stations of the 2d order, displaying cold-wave signals; to take effect July 1, 1887, or as soon thereafter as practicable. [3660, Sig., 1887.]

V. Chincoteague, Virginia, will be discontinued as a station of the 2d order, displaying cautionary signals and taking temperature of water observations daily; to take effect July 1, 1887. [3284, Sig., 1887.]

VI. Cape Henlopen, Delaware, will be discontinued as a station of the 3d order, displaying cautionary signals; to take effect July 1, 1887. [3284, Sig., 1887.]

VII. Ocean City, Maryland, will be discontinued as a station of the 3d order; to take effect July 1, 1887. [3284, Sig., 1887.]

Officers and Assistants charged with special duties will take the necessary action.
