BARKER'S PATENT AIR MIXER

— IS —

Intended to REGULATE the Density of Air Gas, and is manipulated by adjusting the Screw at the Right upper corner.

Moving the fulcrum to the Left, reduces the quality of the Gas; to the Right, enriches it.

DIRECTIONS:

See that the cylinder is kept full of water, replenishing when necessary.

When the lights become thin and pale, it indicates too large a proportion of air, and that the gas needs enriching by reducing the quantity of air. To do this move the fulcrum by means of the screw to the right or towards the end of the lever.

When the light is thick and smoky it shows that the proportion of air is too small; the gas is too rich. To reduce it, move the fulcrum towards the centre. The Test Burner will always indicate the quality of the gas.

When replenishing the Generator with fresh Gasolene, shut the cock in the main gas pipe near the Mixer. Open it after replenishing. Do not meddle with any nuts or screws about the Mixer only as directed above.

The Mixer requires but little attention, and only for the purposes specified in these directions. When regulating the quality of the gas as directed, do not change the fulcrum too rapidly; a few turns of the screw makes a marked change. Turn the screw a couple of times and then wait and note the effect on the Test Burner; proceed in this way till the proper quality of gas is obtained. The burner near the Mixer is called a Test Burner.

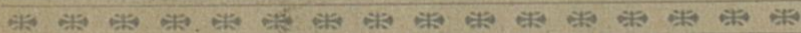

Duplicate receipts, in the form prescribed by each Company, ready for signing, must accompany the delivery of the Freight to the Company.

No responsibility will be admitted, under any circumstances, to a greater amount upon any single article of Freight than \$200, unless upon notice given of such amount and a special agreement therefor. Specie, Drafts, Bank Bills, and other articles of great intrinsic or representative value, will only be taken upon a representation of their value, and by a special agreement assented to by the Superintendent.

The Company will not hold themselves liable at all for any injury to any articles of Freight, during the course of transportation, arising from the weather or accidental delays. Nor will they guarantee any special despatch in the transportation of such articles, unless made the subject of express stipulation. Nor will they hold themselves liable, AS COMMON CARRIERS, for such articles, after their arrival at their place of destination and unloading at the Company's warehouses or Depots.

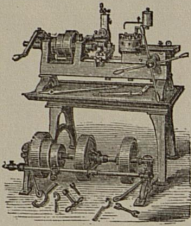
