EXTRACT FROM BY-LAWS

BANK OF LOUISVILLE.

(Loss of certificate of stock supplied.)

ART. 11. "If any person claims a certificate of bank stock to be issued in lieu of one lost or destroyed, he shall make an affidavit or affirmation of the fact and state the circumstances of the loss or destruction; and he shall advertise in one or more of the newspapers in Louisville, twice a week for the space of six weeks, an account of the loss or destruction, describing the certificate, and calling on all persons to show cause why a new certificate shall not be issued by the bank in lieu of the one lost or destroyed; and he shall transmit to the bank his affidavit or affirmation, with the advertisements before mentioned; and he shall give to the bank a bond of indemnity, with one or more sureties if so required, in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for each share of stock to be renewed, against any damage that may arise from issuing the new certificate. Whereupon the cashier shall, two months after the last advertisement as aforesaid, issue a new certificate of the same tenor with the one alleged to be lost or destroyed, and therein specifying that it is in lieu thereof."


