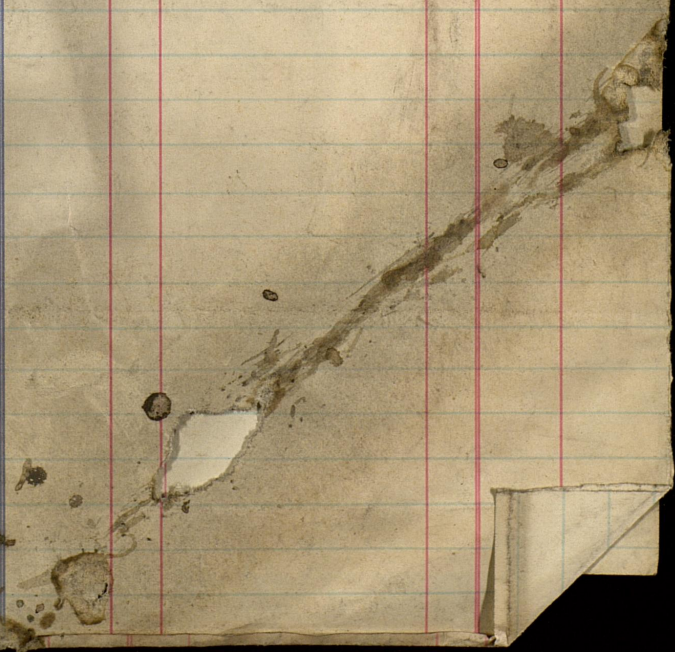

**London Assurance Corporation.**



**T**HE London Assurance Corporation is the oldest organization of its kind doing business in this country, and the oldest, with two exceptions, in the world. It was, under the authority of the Act of Parliament, 6 Geo. I, Cap. xviii. on June 22, 1720, incorporated by royal charter from His Majesty King George the First for the assurance of ships, goods and merchandises at sea or going to sea. By another royal charter, dated April 29, 1721, the London Assurance of Houses and Goods from Fire was empowered to grant assurances upon lives, and also against casualties or accidents by fire. Subsequent Acts of Parliament for the regulation of the affairs of these corporations were passed from time to time; and by the Act of 16 Vic. Cap. i., the two chartered corporations were consolidated into one stock company.

Thus, for over a century and a half, this veteran association has furnished absolute indemnity to the army of policy-holders who wisely trusted it to protect their property from fire and their wives and children from poverty. It has without interruption through these one hundred and sixty years carried on the business for which it was organized, and laid a foundation and builded a structure that is as enduring as the eternal hills. It is no wonder, however, that the corporation should have been managed with great care from the start, when we consider that for the privileges granted it by royal charter it was required to pay into the exchequer of the Crown the sum of \$1,500,000 within ten months from the date of its organization, and that a default of thirty days in the payment of this money involved the forfeiture of its charter. How many insurance companies of our time could or would pay such a consideration for the privileges granted under their charters? Another peculiarity in its charter, which differs from any similar organization, is in reference to its capital stock.

**T**HE official organization of the company consists of a governor, deputy governor, and a court of twenty-four directors. The governor to hold the office is required to be the owner of \$10,000 of the company's stock; the deputy governor \$7,500, and each director \$5,000. The owner of \$2,500 of its stock is entitled to one vote, \$5,000 two votes, \$15,000 three votes, \$25,000 four votes, and so on, each \$5,000 giving him an additional vote.

Each department of the business is kept entirely separate and distinct, even the investments are made and held distinct in the different departments of fire, marine and life insurance. Each branch of business also bears its own expenses, instead of being charged in one general account. The capital stock of the corporation is \$4,482,750, one-half, or \$2,241,375 of which is paid in cash, and the balance at the call of the court of directors. The gross funds, by balance sheet of December 31st, 1879, were \$15,886,110. Of this \$8,746,798 belongs to the life department; \$619,075 to the marine, and the balance, \$6,520,237, is the amount available for the payment of fire losses, should such an enormous sum ever be required, which is not at all probable or even presumable, as the corporation does comparatively a very small business, and that in the most conservative manner. Conservatism, in fact, seems always to have been its guiding star. The fire premium income for 1879 amounted to \$1,051,573, and the losses were only \$563,956, or about 53 per cent. of the premiums. The entire expense of management, including commissions paid, footed up \$329,438, or a little more than 31 per cent. The par value of the shares is £25, on which £12½ is paid, and the market price is £66 per share, or 550 per cent.

There can be no question that as a sound, stable and well managed company, the London Assurance Corporation is the equal of any institution of its kind in the world.

It began business in the United States in 1872, and on Jan. 1, 1881, had assets in this country amounting to \$1,287,502.78, the total liabilities were only \$441,505.67, which gives it a surplus of \$845,997.11. Of the assets over One Million Dollars in U. S. government bonds.
