Feb 23, 1900

The faculty met in adjourned session in the President's room in the College building at 3pm  
Present: President Patterson, Prof. White, W. S. Patterson, Kastle, Roark, Mathews, Pryor, Neville, Peuce, Anderson, Merrick, Mackenzie, Brooks, and Major Carpenter

Mr. J. F. Musselman was present and heard a brief statement of the charges against his son and then retired.

It was moved by Prof Roark second by Prof Merrick  
Musselman's care of that the section of the report of the Board of Discipline, which fixes the punishment in the case of Colet Musselman be approved. Carried as follows:  
Aye - Prof. White, Neville, Kastle, Roark, Pryor, Mathews, Peuce, Merrick, Brooks, Carpenter, - 10  
No - Anderson, - 1  
Profs Mackenzie and Patterson not voting.

It was determined that announcement of the punishment should be made by the President of the College, in the presence of the young men connected with the college.

Ordered that a committee of three be appointed from the faculty, to meet a committee from the Association of Alumni to arrange for a proper reception to be given a joint committee on the A. & M. College from the Legislature

The Chair appointed Prof. Brooks, Pryor, and Anderson,

Ordered on motion of Prof. Roark that the examinations closing this the second term begin on the 12th of March.
