But a new era in Gator football appears at hand. The Sunshine State crew, which humiliated UK, 27-0, in a meaningless, uninspired (for the Cats) season finale last year, is pegged as a title threat in the Southeastern Conference picture for 1953. Big Rick Casares (20), the Gator's stellar fullback, appears to be fully recovered from injuries received in a mid-August auto accident and should be hitting the stride predicted for him. Another big gun in the Florida arsenal is All-SEC guard Joe D'Agostino (76), one of the best linemen in the league. End Jack O'Brien (86) and guard-center Sonny May (49), along with Casares, represent the Floridians as tri-

PAUL (Bear) BRYANT Head Football Coach University of Kentucky

One of the nation's most outstanding football mentors by tests of both success and leadership in the collegiate field, Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant has lifted Kentucky out of the football doldrums and firmly established them in national prominence.

The youthful former Alabama star end, who risked a promising future when he moved to Kentucky in 1946, is recognized and respected in the grid world for his successful record with the Wildcats—winners of 53 games while losing only 21 and tieing four in the seven seasons of the Bryant Era, including four major bowl appearances and a conference title.

Bryant also is known as a pioneer, unafraid to take a chance on something that seems right, and this attitude is reflected in a unique policy adopted in 1952. Firmly believing widespread recruiting of high school standouts to be one of the game's biggest evils, the Kentucky chieftan voluntarily took the lead in restricting recruiting of players to home-state boundaries. He decreed a "Kentucky first" plan that limited out-of-state scholarship grants to five per year and ordered that in all cases the non-resident "must seek us out voluntarily."


That the amazing Mr. Bryant has been right before pleases his followers and worries his opponents. In 1946, when he gave up the reins at Maryland after a successful first season as head coach, Bear asked for a five-year contract. He explained that it would take that time to get the Wildcats established in winning ways. The final chapter of Bryant's "Five-Year Plan" was written in 1950 with a sensational flourish. As predicted,

was written in 1950 with a sensational nourish. As pledicted, Kentucky hit its winning stride by capturing the school's first Southeastern Conference championship on a 10-1 record and pulled the upset-of-the-century in knocking off national champion Oklahoma in the Sugar Bowl. The road to national prominence has not been an easy one, but Coach Bryant can look back on a record of never having experienced a losing campaign.







Bob Woodruff is a slow-moving, deep-thinking, result-getting native Georgian who did in three years with the Florida Gators what twelve predecessors had attempted over a span of two score: He piloted them into a post-season bowl game and produced Florida's second All-American football player.

Bob Woodruff was born in Athens, Georgia, on March 14, 1916, but the family soon moved to Cuthbert, Georgia. He lived there until he was sixteen years of age, played on Cuthbert High's first football team and then moved to Savannah to play three years at Savannah High School.

During the seasons of 1936-37-38, Woodruff was a standout tackle on the teams of General Bob Neyland.
