Keeneland Hall Welcomes Mothers

Each of the girls was presented with a small silver bowl and a bouquet of red roses. Miss Perry had her name engraved on a big silver bowl given to the farm by the Keeneland Racing Association. Her name is placed beneath the names of the other girls who have been honored with the title of Miss Keeneland in the last ten years.
