The president read a communication from Judge Barker of the Board of Trustees in which attention was called to utterances of a disrespectful character towards members of the faculty, which had been heard at ~~previous~~ ^{June 1904} class day exercises, and recommending that all such productions of students designed for public occasions should be edited by the faculty.

On motion of Prof. Wernicke seconded by Prof. Miller it was ordered that the existing regulations upon this subject be rigidly enforced.

The secretary was instructed to communicate the substance of these regulations to those students who are to participate in such public exercises during Commencement week.
