

He came to the UK campus way back in 1909, and he must have liked-what he saw, for Prof. Zdwarf F. Farquhar has been here ever since. The entire faculty, a distinguished group of white-bearded gentlemen, "could sit in one row at semblies in the old chapel in the Administration saidtine."

The 69-year-young English professor had been veteran of 11 years in the teaching profession beore a youngster named Herman L. Donovan sat in

his classroom. He has seen his former students go on to assume leading roles in local, state, and national affairs. Some of them include former Gov. "Happy" Clandler, Sen. Thomas Underwood, the late Sen. Virgil Chapman, and the Hon. William Prownsend.

Prof. Farquhar founded the first amateur theater at UK. The playhouse was known as the "Saxe-Rominy;" and was truly a community project. "We recruited our casts from students, neighbors, and department store clerks," he said. It was an idealistic venture but it worked. A counterpart of the "Saxe" was an ambitious student dramatic organization, "The Strollers," which he also fostered.
