

Marcos gives firing option

MANILA, Philippines — President Ferdinand E. Marcos yesterday ordered soldiers to shoot protesters if necessary and threatened widespread arrests in a new military crack-down. But the opposition toughened and warned it might launch a nationwide sit-down to drive him from office.
