

State University of Kentucky.

December 4, 1908.

The regular monthly meeting of the Faculty occurred in the President's room at 3:30 P.M., those present being Professors White, W.K. Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Zembrod, Tuttle, Rowe, Frankel, Maxson and Jones, Professor White in the chair President Patterson being detained by illness.

The minutes of the last meeting were read, and, with the modification that in the report of Professor Anderson's committee the degree of Master of Science in Agriculture should be inserted, were adopted.

On motion of Professor Tuttle, seconded by Professor Rowe, it was ordered that hereafter the major study of a student be designated in the catalog and that the proper modifying clause be appended to the degree on the diploma.

Professor White called attention to the fact that the University catalog as published indicated that the Christmas holidays begin on Thursday, December 25th., evidently intended to mean Dec. 24th., and suggested that if the exercises close upon Thursday it would prevent many students from reaching their homes until Christmas day, and furthermore suggested that if, as scheduled, the second term should commence upon Monday, January 4th. it would involve the necessity of students returning upon the preceding Saturday or traveling upon the Sabbath day, or in the case of many the result would be that they would come late, and he stated that following a conference with President Patterson, he had proposed to the student body that they would agree upon honor to be back upon Tuesday, January 5th. ready for work provided the holidays were extended to that date. It was therefore moved by Professor Anderson, seconded by Professor Pryor, that the holidays begin upon the close of work Wednesday December 23rd., and that class work begin on Tuesday, January 5th., 1909. The motion was carried.

Professor Frankel moved that the chairman appoint a committee to act with a corresponding committee of the Alumni to see what steps might be taken toward the removal of saloons and certain other nuisances in the vicinity of the University. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pryor and after some discussion, was carried. Professor White announced that he would appoint the committee after conference with Professor Frankel.

The schedule of examination preceding the holidays was then discussed, and upon motion of Professor Mathews, seconded by Prof. Zembrod, it was ordered that the schedule proposed by Professor White be adopted. It was further proposed that a committee be appointed to confer with Professor White in reference to arranging the details of the schedule, and Professor White requested to serve upon this committee Professors Anderson and Maxson. Dr. Maxson suggested that a copy of the schedule be placed in the hands of every instructor in the institution. Professor White called attention to the fact that the President had suggested to him the desirability of having a committee to consider the whole question of college records, and that he had suggested the appointment upon this committee of Professors White, Miller and Rowe. Upon motion of Professor Anderson, seconded by Professor Frankel, it was ordered that this committee be so appointed. The meeting adjourned.
