GARDEN FLOWER VARIETY TEST IN KENTUCKY, 1964

More and more garden annuals are used in home and industrial plantings each year. Thus, it is increasingly important to provide needed information to commercial producers and consumers about the many varieties and how these varieties perform under local regional conditions. The trial gardens at the University of Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station offer opportunities to interested persons to compare the many varieties.

Seed, supplied by seed companies interested in trial results, was sown during the first part of April 1964. The seed was sown in flats filled with vermiculite and was covered with a fine layer of peat moss. Black polyethylene plastic was placed over the seed flats to hold in moisture until germination. When the seedlings had developed two true leaves, 48 of them were transplanted into flats. Starting the middle of May, the plants were transplanted to the prepared garden where trial plots 5 feet square were laid out in rows with a 5-foot walkway between rows. Fifteen to 25 plants were placed in each plot, depending on the growth characteristic of each variety. Water was applied by a sprinkler system as necessary throughout the summer. After the plants had become established ammonium nitrate fertilizer was applied.

Varieties were evaluated on two different dates during the summer of 1964.

The first date was July 17. At this time almost all of the flowers were in full bloom.

Another evaluation was made on September 23. By then the flowers had been in full bloom for two months. This second evaluation gives a good idea of how long the plants give a good display. A good bedding plant should be appealing for at least 2 months during the summer. Each variety was given a rating of "excellent," "very good," "fair," or "poor" based on its usefulness, uniformity and general appeal.
