Cyberspace attacks

WASHINGTON — Federal law enforcement authorities will do all in their power to combat a wave of Internet vandalism, Attorney General Janet Reno promised vesterday, Responding to a rash of attacks that disrupted a number of flagship Web sites, Reno said "these cyber-assaults have caused millions of Internet users to be denied services." Internet vandals have waged a campaign of electronic assaults on top Web sites, including Yahoo, eBay, Buy.com and Amazon.com. Even today, the online brokerage ETrade said its Web site was attacked.

Boeing engineers go on strike

SEATTLE — Engineers and technicians walked off the job yesterday at Boeing after last-ditch talks with a federal mediator failed to reach an agreement on a labor contract. The Society of Professional Engineering Employees in Aerospace, Boeing's second-largest union, represents about 22,000 workers. The union is seeking more guaranteed pay raises and bousses similar to those received by production workers represented by the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers.

WASHINGTON — Ignoring President Clinton's call for restraint, House Republicans set a vote for today on a 10-year, \$182 billion income tax cut for millions of married couples that will force Democrats to make a difficult political choice. Part of the GOP's election-year strategy is to stage individual votes on the more popular parts of the \$792 billion tax cut vetoed by Clinton last year, giving Republican candidates in competitive districts a potent issue to exploit if Democrats vote against them.

Use hands-free devices when possible. A number of hands-free, wireless phone accessories are available.

Position the cell phone within asy reach where you can grab it without removing your eyes from the road.

Suspend conversations during hazardous driving conditions or situations. Be sure to let the person with whom you are speaking know you are driving and avoid emotional, distracting con-versations.

Dial sensibly and assess the traf-fic. If possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Attempt to place your calls when you may be stopped at a stop sign.

Theologist to explain how all things 'live' in a way

Father Diarmuid O Murchu, traveled from London, to give a speech quite different from UK's average Free Speech Area sermon. Murchu states that even desks are "moving" and "alive."

Janice Sevre-Dusynska, a
member of the Newman Foundation Speaker's Committee
that selected Murchu, said that
he was selected for his popularity and for the depth of his mes-

sage.

"He teaches about how the whole is greater than the sum of its parts, about the value of all relationships," Dusynska said, "He is a visionary."

Murchu, who lives and works in London, is a priest of the Sacred Heart Missionaries and works as a counselor and social psychologist in a home less shelter for boys. He has lee-

tured all over the world and written several books about aspects of spirituality in the modern world.

An element of his lectures and books is the idea that all hings are living and interrelated. Murchu uses several examples to illustrate this point, including the fact that when a desk is analyzed under a powerful microscope, it is shown to be a collection of moving particles.

Head coach Keith Madison begins his hirld decade of coaching at UK with an optimistic outlook for this season.

"We are a veteran team offensively for the first time in a long time," Madison said. "But if we are going to compete for an SEC title, our young staff is going to have to grow up in a hurry."

Twenty lettermen return this season for the Wildcats, including all eight position players. Pre-season All-American catcher John Wilson, a junior, let the SEC last sea-son with 23 home runs, finished last season on the second team All-SEC and toured last summer with the USA National Team.

Coach Madison feels that Wilson is "one of the premier players in college base-ball."

The Wildcats replace the nine lettermen lost from last season with an incoming class, made up of mostly pitchers, that ranked 25th by Collegiate Baseball. This incoming class includes seven freshmen and two junior college transfers.

If there were any weakness on this

squad, it would be the pitching staff. The returning pitching staff accounted for only 23 of the 57 starts. On the bright side the returning staff did account for more than half of last season's 25 wins.

Das was to hear testimony from Selig and
Braves president Stan Kasten. Gene Orza, the
union's chief lawyer, will argue on Rocker's behalf, and union head Donald Fehr is expected to
testify on past suspensions. It was unclear if
Rocker would testify.

There's no indication how quickly the arbitrator might rule, but the union most likely will
ask for a decision by the start of spring training. The Braves' pitchers and catchers report to
camp at Kissimmee, Pla., on Feb. 17.

Rocker told Sports Illustrated in December

he would never play for a New York team because he didn't want to ride a subway train "next to some queer with AIDS." He also mocked foreigners and called a Latin teammate a "fat monkey."



In this year, Congress this year, Congress considerably tightened the rules for eligibility, requiring that a serviceman come into actual contact with an enemy and perform bravely at the risk of his own life above and beyond the call of duty.

Advising madness

Revamping the advising process so it's easier for students, professors

The Student Government Association would like to start a committee that would create a process of review and accountability for academic advising at UK.

This idea makes good sense. Less than satisfactory advising sessions are frequently told among students. They speak about time when their advisors gave them incorrect or incomplete advise. But when you examine the situation, you can see how things could go wrong.

Professors who advise students are already overworked and see too many students to give each one enough personal attention.

Advisors who aren't professors are somewhat disconnected from the academic and career-development process and are likely overworked as well.

University administrators should make the improvement of advising a priority. Good advising contributes to a student's successful academic career, which in turn influences the quality of their university.

Advising should be as easy as possible. When it's not easy, it's not done right. A reference book for advisors would be a good place to begin. This book would contain all the bureau-cratic red tape involved in obtaining a degree, as well as all the loopholes for the special cases that occur in real life.

This reference book would be available to students as well as advisors. It would tell students to keep the builetins (their "contract" with the University) they received their first year of college.

It would allow students to answer many of their own questions, so advising meetings would operate more smoothly.

Changes with Central Advising would be another point for improvement. If you're not a professor, you probably know a lot of generalities, but not much about any one specific field of study.

Movie destroys area where it was made

Thanks Leonardo: Environmentalists claim filmmakers have destroyed naturally pristine beach used to film 'The Beach'

MAYA BAY, Thailand — "The Beach." which premiered in London on Wednesday starring Leonardo DiCarpio, tells the story of an amoral backpacker whose quest for the perfect tropical beach leads him to a screet commune on a remote Thai island.

But utopla isn't quite what it seems and paradise turns into bloody savagery. Likewise, the image of sunny, sandy perfection achieved in making the 20th Century Fox film has destroyed the once-pristine beach where it was shot, residents, tourists and environmentalists say.

Maya Bay, a strip of sand and vegetation

November, it became clear the stakes the filmmakers set in the sand to prevent erosion didn't work nearly as well as native vegetation. More sand than anyone could remember was washed away by the annual storms.

There is now a \$2.6 million lawsuit against Fox, the Forestry Department and the Agriculture Ministry for damage to Maya Bay.

"There is no beautiful beach anymore," said Prasertponges Sornuwat, a local council member. "They just want to cash in on the movie, with no concern about environmental impact." Some tourists agree.

"The beach looks awful," said Alastair Short, 40, a tourist from Worcester, England, visiting the island with friends. "We decided to come by and see with our own eyes what had happened. A lawyer for 20th Century Fox defended the filmmakers, saying they took every precaution and the erosion was caused by unusually severe storms, not the filmmakers' actions.

"I'm confident the claim about the erosion is groundless," said the lawyer, Dusti Walee.

The damage to Maya Bay may not be finished yet. Ecologists fear the loosened sand could damage fraigle coral reefs on the beach front.

That could threaten the livelihoods of hundreds of boatmen who bring sunbathers to Maya Bay.

"Maya Bay is falling apart in front of us," said Surat Saewkok, who has taken tourists sight-seeing here for 15 years.

"Who wants to visit an even even going beach?" Surat said. "The film people are all gone and are going to make money selling their movie, but villagers here are paying the prior."

Columnist licks doorknobs

This guy has real issues: Comic writer poses as Republican volunteer, tries to give Bauer flu

Dan Savage, gay writer of an outrageous and comically explicit sex-advice column, is waging either germ warfare or a disinformation campaign against the religious right.

He claimed recently that while posing as a volunteer for Gary Bauer's campaign in Iowa, he licked office doorknobs and coffee cups and handleked office doorknobs and coffee cups and handleked for the control of the control of

Bauer's rhetoric against homosexuals and gay marriage.

Either way, the episode was characteristic of a man who regularly pushes boundaries in his Seattle-based column "Savage Love," which appears in 28 alternative newspapers around the country, including the Village Voice in New York, and is read by an estimated 4 million people a

week.
"In the context of my column, people under-stand sometimes I'm pulling your leg, sometimes I'm not," Savage says. "In this case, people lacked that context."

that context."

Savage, who with his partner recently adopted a little boy, is the very incarnation of all that the Christian conservative movement despises.

There is no sex act too perverse, no sex subject too outlandish for him to delve bithely into—often in blush-inducing detail.

Savage can also talk about family values — like the domestic bliss he has found raising a

child. Much of what he says about parenting could just as well come from the mouths of straight parents, such as lack of sleep and the struggle to retain a sense of romance with his partner.

"If the religious right really wanted to stop gay sex," he quipped in a recent interview, "they should get behind gay people adopting, because nothing puts a stop to gay sex faster."

Savage wrote about his lowa experience in a recent story in Salon com called "Stalking Gary Bauer's lowa campigna manager, Loras Schulte, the only campaign worker known to have gotten the flu after Savage's lowa visit, confirmed that Savage was a hardworking volunteer for Bauer, who has since dropped out of the race.

Savage says he really did get Bauer's autograph with a pen he handed to him, and he did cast a vote in last month's presidential caucuses—for Alan Keyes, reasoning that Keyes would do most damage to the GOP's chances.

"I think that it's unfortunate that one bad apple came to lowa and tried unsuccessfully to dispute any of the came of the came of the came of the proposed out of the roud charges against Savage for masquerading as a Republican and voting in the caucuses. Savage is quick to blame lowa officials, who did not check his identification at the caucus site to see if he really was a registered lowa voter.

"It was too easy to do," Savage says. "I don't want to go to jail in lowa. That's redundant."

Savage says he was just joking about trying to give Bauer the flu.

"At that stage of the campaign, Bauer had probably been exposed to everything — shaking hands with thousands of people and picking up bables," Savage says. "He was probably more of a threat to me."
