

Man who impersonated pilot convicted

Man who impersonated pilot convicted NEW YORK. An Egyptian man who flew to Kennedy International Airport in September with a fake pilot's uniform and license was convicted Thursday of lying to investigators about his plans to attend aviation school. But jurors acquitted Wael Abdel Rahman Kishk. 21, on a second charge of trying to impersonate a pilot by carrying a forged document. Kishk faces up to five years in prison on a federal charge of making false statements. A sentencing date wasn't immediately set. Kishk. 21, was detained at Kennedy Airport in New York on Sept. 19 after arriving on a flight from Barcelona, Spain, that had originated in Cairo. During a routine search of his luggage, immigration agents discovered a fake Federal Aviation Administration document purportedly giving him medical clearance to fly rosses in the court of the control o
