The faculty met at 3.30 P.M. those present being the president, Professors J. G. White, W. R. Patterson, Poyer, Anderson, Mathews, Pence, Markuniz, Norwood, Burt, M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Gumbrod, Rowe and Frankel.

Minutes of the last three meetings were read and approved.

Gov. Beckham
offensive pub.
regarding G. in
"Transit"

Prof. Norwood made a report of his interview with Governor Beckham, in which the Governor expressed his appreciation of the action taken by the faculty in reference to the offensive publication in the "Transit" and said that so far as he was concerned, he was entirely satisfied with the situation.

Prof. Rowe reported that he had interviewed Mr. Barr with reference to a retraction, and he read to the faculty what Mr. Barr proposed to publish in the next issue of the "Transit" as a retraction.

Major Burt moved that the matter be left in the hands of the committee to make report to the faculty after the retraction had been published. Seconded by O. W. Mathews.

Prof. Markuniz proposed as an amendment, that the committee have power to act. The amendment was accepted and the motion as amended was unanimously adopted.

Indictment &
conviction of
students in
civil courts.

The motion of Prof. M. White offered on Nov. 23, relative to students indicted and convicted in the civil courts, was then called up.

Prof. W. K. Patterson offered the following substitute motion which was seconded by Dr. Poyer.

1. That any student of this College who may hereafter be convicted of violating any law of this Commonwealth or any ordinance of the City of Lexington, shall be ipso facto dismissed and shall not be reinstated except by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the whole faculty or by the mandate of the Board of Trustees.

2. That this resolution shall be made known to the student body as soon as practicable and shall hereafter be published as one of the regulations of the College.

The substitute motion upon an Aye and No vote was lost. vote recorded as follows.

Prof. Peerce proposed an amendment to the original motion, which was accepted by the mover and seconder of the motion, making it read as follows:-

"Resolved, that hereafter any matriculate of the college who may be convicted by the civil courts for a misdemeanor or a felony, shall ipso facto be dismissed, and that such convicted misdemeanor or felon can be re-instated only by action of the faculty or by the Board of Trustees."

The motion was lost upon an Aye and No vote, as follows.

Prof Mackenzie, Chairman of the Com. upon Absences reported to the faculty the cases of Messrs. N. H. Gay, A. H. Ummitum and R. M. Clay, as students who had *parents requested to withdraw him* been most frequently absent, in order that the faculty might take action regarding them.

Mr. Ummitum appeared before the faculty and admitted very frequent absences from classes for which he had little or no excuse to offer.

Upon motion of Prof Anderson, seconded by Prof Rowe it was ordered that the president should request his father to withdraw him from the college, because upon the general testimony of his professors his time is being completely wasted here.

Upon an aye and no vote the ^{affirmation} ayes were unanimous.

Prof M. White presented a schedule of studies embodying certain changes in the Normal course. which upon motion of Prof Anderson, seconded by Prof Wilson was referred to a committee of the Deans most concerned, with power to act; the deans named being Prof J. G. White, Nevien and M. White.

The meeting adjourned to meet on Monday Dec. 10 at 3 P. M.
