

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

April 9, 1934

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall, President McVey presiding.

The Minutes of March 12 were read and approved.

Standing committees of the Senate made reports which were received and ordered to be included in the minutes, as follows:

Auditing Committee for Student Activities - Professor Downing, Chm.

(In connection with this report it was announced that the Board of Trustees had passed a resolution that fraternities be required to present a budget to the office of the Dean of Men and a monthly report on their financial status; that any member who fails to pay his bills may be prevented from registering at the University or getting a transcript to another institution, or advancing into another class until his obligations are met.)

Student Social Affairs - T. T. Jones, Chairman

"In the Fall about November 1, we regularly report the social calendar for the year. This contains a list of the groups giving social functions and the date of each. But I have found that the date set down is subject to much change; new conditions arise which make another date preferable. Also students have not known to whom they should apply for use of the gym, and so they have applied to any or all of three places with much confusion and uncertainty resulting.

About two weeks ago we were faced with a situation where each Saturday night the gym was claimed by at least two organizations. A conference was held by the President, Dr. Funkhouser, Mr. D. H. Peak, Mr. Crutcher, and myself and it was decided that beginning at once permission to use the gym should be given by the Office of the Dean of Men. Upon sending for the claimants for the use of the building in every case only one man came. The others abandoned their claim.

We have had the usual number of dances, no more and perhaps a few less; there is none for next Saturday evening. The real social events do not begin until the second semester. The number attending has been increasing until the gym has been filled at the last two dances. There is nearly always some drinking, more or less, but there has been no disorder. If we have a dozen intoxicated men out of 1200 the percentage of drunkenness is not large. At every dance except one we have had two city policemen to assist in handling the crowd and in keeping order. No objection has been made and the boys in charge of the dance usually ask me to get policemen!"

CONSTITUTION OF THE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION
UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

Article 1.

Name

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Athletic Association of the University of Kentucky.

Article 2

Membership

Section 1. Members of the Athletic Association of the University of Kentucky shall be limited to the students and members of the University staff.

Article 3.

Annual Meeting

Section 1. The annual meeting of the Athletic Association shall be held in September of each year and special meetings may be called at any time by the President of the University, all such meetings to be presided over by the chairman of the Athletic Council.

Article 4.

Council

Section 1. The government of the Athletic Association of the University of Kentucky and the control of funds and property of the Association shall be vested in the Athletic Council.

Section 2. This Council shall consist of five members of the faculty of the University, three alumni or business or professional men other than alumni, residing in Fayette County, two undergraduate students, and the President of the University. All members of the Athletic Council shall be appointed by the President of the University. The term of office of the five representatives of the faculty and of the residents of Fayette County shall be for three years. The terms shall be arranged so that one resident of Fayette County and at least one faculty member shall be installed annually. The student members of the Athletic Council shall be appointed by the President of the University at the beginning of each school year. Their term of office shall be for one year.

Section 3. The officers of the Athletic Council shall be a chairman and a secretary-treasurer, both appointed by the President of the University

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the chairman to preside at all meetings of the Council. It shall be the duty of the secretary-treasurer to keep the minutes of the meetings, to receive and disburse all money of the Athletic Association as directed by the Athletic Council, to make an annual report to the Association, to the President, to the Senate committee on Finance and to the Council. The books of the secretary-treasurer shall be audited annually as of July 1.

Section 5. The Athletic Council shall have authority to make all By Laws necessary for its government.

Article 5.

Amendments

Section 1. This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of all of the members of the Athletic Council by and with the approval of the University Senate."

College of Arts and Sciences

History 106 - Latin America, three credits. To be replaced by History 106a - Colonial Latin America, 2 credits and History 106b - Latin American Republics, 2 credits.

College of Agriculture

Change Animal Industry 135 to Animal Industry 35 - Artificial Incubation and Brooding.

Farm Economics 103a-b to Farm Economics 203a-b - Agricultural Economics Seminar.

College of Engineering

Changes in Titles

Mechanical Engineering 12 - change title from "Automotive Engineering" to "Elements of the Automobile."

Mechanical Engineering 13 - change title from "Principles of Engineering Thermodynamics" to "Engineering Thermodynamics I."

Mechanical Engineering 14 - change title from "Advanced Engineering Thermodynamics" to "Engineering Thermodynamics II."

Minutes of the University Senate - April 9, 1934

At the request of President McVey, action on requests for new courses was withheld for the present. He asked that all courses be reviewed with a view of determining whether they meet the needs and whether there are too many courses, or whether they should be developed on the idea of covering wider fields. He stated that each department should determine its objective and whether its courses were meeting that objective.

The President announced that funeral services for Dean Anderson would be held Wednesday, April 11, at 3 p.m. in the Memorial Auditorium, and that classes would be dismissed for the day. He appointed the following committee to draw up resolutions; Messrs. Grehan, Nollau, and Bureau.

Announcement was made concerning the memorial service for members of the staff and students who have died this year, to be held Thursday, May 31.

President McVey called attention to the meeting of the K. E. A., April 19-21 and the University reception on the evening of the 19th and urged the attendance of members of the faculty.
