Student death still not known

"He could put a smile on anybody's face," David Ernspiker, 20, said of his roommate, Bobby Lanier, 18, who collapsed and died yesterday during a basketball game with friends in the Seaton Center.

Lanier was a freshman at UK. The Fayette County Coroner could not be reached for comment on the cause of Lanier's death Monday.

Ernspiker said Lanier, a Louisville native and graduate of Pleasure Ridge Park High School, was the kind of guy who looked out for his friends and had a wonderful sense of humor.

"His personality was great... he'd do

anything for you," Ernspiker said.
Ernspiker, also from Louisville, and Lanier did not know each other before they became roommates. Immediately they became best of friends along with two others. Chris Wragg and Majemite "M.J" Begho, who were there when Lanier collapsed.
"Everywhere we went, we went together," Ernspiker said. "I loved him like he was a brother."

Ernspiker said. anier was very close to his family, particularly his grandmother.
Ernspiker described Lanier as six feet tall, slim but not skinny, and light skinned with a small afro.
"He was very athletic ... there was nothing he couldn't do." Ernspiker said.
Ernspiker said he regrets he wasn't

there when Lanier collapsed, and as a life-guard he wonders if there was anything he could have done to help the situation. After Lanier collapsed at the Seaton Center, he was taken to the UK Chandler Medical Center. Ernspiker waited with friends at the hospital until Lanier's family arrived, but the doctors would not divulge any informa-tion to non-family. Lanier was pronounced dead at 4:49

All three denied that assertion.

Umbilical may provide important cells

SAN FRANCISCO — Umbilical cords dis-carded after birth may offer a wast new source of repair material for fixing brains damaged by strokes and other ills, free of the ethical con-cerns surrounding the use of fetal tissue, re-searchers said Sunday, In animal experiments, at least, cells from umbilical cords appear to greatly speed recovery after strokes. They work with a simple infusion into the blood stream without the need for direct implantation into the brain. Although many details need to be worked out, Dr. Paul R. Sanberg of the University of South Florida said he hopes to try the approach on stroke victims within the next year or two.

Earnhardt's death renews safety debate

DATTONA BEACH, Fla. — Dale Earnhardt believed an open-faced helmet was as asfe as those high-tech models worn by most of today's drivers. He mocked restrictor plates, saying any competitor who supported slower speeds was a chicken and should find another line of work. A neck brace? Forget about it. Earnhardt had survived and thrived for more than two decades without one of those newfangled devices. He saw no need to change ways in the twilight of his career. But the swashbuckling life of stock car racing's greatest star erided Sunday on the final lap of the Daytona 500 when his black No. 3 Chevrolet slammed into a wall at 180 mph. Doctors said Earnhardt, 49, died instantly from massive trauma at the base of his skull — Just the kind of injury that led to the invention of the Head And Neck Safety (HANS) system.

About a half-dozen drivers donned the U-shaped device for the 500, but Earnhardt and most of those in the 43-car field shaped it as bulky and un-

Earnhardt and most of those in the 43-car field shuned it as bulky and un-comfortable.

Dale Jarrett wore the HANS for the first time at Daytona. His crew chief, Todd Parrott, said it's time for all drivers to follow suit.

the same type of injury.

The HANS was designed to lessen the pressure on the most vulnerable part of the body—the neck and base of the skull—in the type of high-impact crashes that killed all four drivers.

The CART open-wheel series has mandated the device for all of its oval races this year, and the Formula One series is expected to require the HANS in 2002.

But NASCAR, heeding the concerns of its drivers, has so far declined to make the device mandatory. Officials say additional tests are needed to determine its effectiveness in the 3,500-model cars.

"I really think they should wear the HANS," said Melvin, who was brought to North Carolina last month to lecture Ford and Dodge teams on improving safety. "But the problem right now is getting the HANS fitted properly."

Dr. Steve Bohannan, among the team of doctors who treated Earnhardt at the track and at Halifax Hospital, was asked if the HANS would have saved the driver's life.

"I don't know if the HANS device would have helped," Bohannan

replied. "I suspect not."

Bob Hubbard, a biomechanics professor at Michigan State, helped develop the HANS. He was at the speedway
last week, working with several drivers who are trying to get a comfortable fit.

While he's a fan of the HANS,
Melvin agrees with NASCAR's decision to leave it up to the drivers
