The Faculty met at the usual hour. A furlough for two weeks was granted to Mr. Brevard. Mr. Bailey was present charged with being disrespectful to Col. Swigent. He was required to make a public apology on parade, to Col. and his general conduct was reduced to 50%. From evidence reported to the Faculty it was found that in the fight between Goldsmith and Orear (mentioned May 1st) Goldsmith had provoked Orear to fight and his conduct was therefore reduced to 75%. A. S. Brown the principal witness in the case came up and confessed that he had told a falsehood at the meeting of the Faculty May 1st. His general conduct was reduced 10%. Mr. Hammond asked for a recommendation to the Executive Committee to assist him in procuring permission to teach a school on these grounds during the summer. The consideration of his case was postponed till later in the session. On motion the Faculty adjourned.

May 10th

A meeting of the Faculty was called by Pres. Patterson, in his room, at 12 o'clock to consider applications of several students of the four-hour labor department for honorable discharges. Messrs Ryals, Brevard, Eastham, Whitacre, and Ferguson asked for honorable discharges, stating that in consequence of their refusal to buy milk from the University Milk Cart, Regent Brown had told them that they could be employed in the working department no longer, and that as they depended upon their work to pay their board they would now be compelled to leave. Their request was granted. Messrs Carrington, Smith, and Phelps made the same request, as those just mentioned, but not being of age they were required to procure the consent of their parents or guardians. A furlough for two weeks was granted to Mr. A. D. Hays, and Mr. Crawford was allowed to leave the labor department, provided they obtained the consent of Mr. Dean, the Superintendent of that department.
