The The conclusion of the rushing season for both ing season for both ing fact has become evident. Both fraternities and sororities are beginning to act more maturely in the methods employed during this season.

In previous years the sororities regularly came o blows with each other and with governing oodies over rushing rules. Each year some group was accused of using "dirty rushing" tactics. Fortunately this year there have been no such accusations. This year more freedom was allowed during this season. It is evidently a step in the proper direction.

But it is still evident that there is considerable mprovement possible. For a number of reasons deferred rushing plan would be more suitable. fore suitable for both fraternities and sororities.

More suitable for both fraternities and soporities. In the final analysis there is but one major advantage that belonging to the Greek lodges offers, and that is social contacts. All other promises lavished on freshmen during the hectic rushing hours are merely for matter of making an impression. With this in mind, it becomes evident that it is of primary importance for a man or woman to become associated with a group with the most common interests. Is it possible for either man or woman to definitely decide in one week's time as to what group they like best? Especially considering the fact that targroup is not seen in its true light during the rushing season, is it difficult to make this decision.

If both men and women were allowed to live on the campus and observe the normal behavior of Greek groups, they certainly can obtain a better idea as to what group suits them best. In one semester they can learn of the financial sta-tus of the group which is of considerable im-portance to incoming freshmen.

It has been stated that some houses cannot exist because of graduates leaving that particular group with few active members. Certainly sophomores juniors, and seniors can maintain the fraternity for one semester. If there are so few of them that this cannot be done, it must certainly signify that something is wrong with the lodge.

After a lapse of one semester, it would become ractically impossible for one to join a wrong buse—while at present this is not uncommon.

At the same time a more concerted drive could At the same time a more concerted drive could be made in rushing sophomores and juniors, and it could be done in a much saner fashion. These men and women, many of whom have a desire to join a group after observing it for one or two years, are forgotten during the mad rush for freshmen. And members of this group could undoubtedly be counted on to make a much fines and more convenid area.

Not only does this deferred system favor the new students, but the Greeks and Greekettes will rush an established character who has both feet

It must be understood that The Kernel is not actually condemning the present system, but it is merely attempting to show the distinct ad-vantages of a deferred system. These advantages are of considerable benefit to both parties con-
