

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY FACULTY, OCTOBER 8, 1962

The University Faculty met in regular session at 4:00 p.m., Monday, October 8, 1962 in the Assembly Room of Lafferty Hall. President Dickey presided.

The minutes of the special meeting of September 21st were approved as circularized with the deletion of "tie vote for 16th place" under results of the first ballot, page 3, which was incorrect.

President Dickey introduced and welcomed to the Faculty Mr. Sydney Swadel, editor of the Bulawayo Chronicle in Southern Rhodesia who was in Lexington to observe and meet with tobacco industry leaders; Mr. Paul Clark of Southeast Center; Mr. Louis Alderman, Northwest Center; Mr. R. L. Goodpaster, Ashland Center; Mr. T. L. Hankins, Northern Center; Mr. James Jones, Fort Knox Center; and Messrs. Gordon Nash and Denver Sloan of Extended Programs.

Dean White presented resolutions on the death of Olus Jesse Stewart, former professor of Chemistry. The Chairman asked the Faculty to stand for a moment of silent tribute in acceptance of the resolutions.

OLUS JESSE STEWART

1884-1962

Dr. Olus Jesse Stewart, Emeritus Professor of Chemistry in the University of Kentucky died July 13, 1962. A native of Ohio he graduated from Ohio State University, received the master's degree at Purdue University and was awarded the Ph.D. degree at Harvard University.

Dr. Stewart was a member of the faculty of the University of New Hampshire for five years. In September 1919 he joined the faculty of the University of Kentucky as an assistant professor. He became a full professor in 1943.

Although appearing rather quiet and retiring, Dr. Stewart was a warm and sincere friend to those who knew him well. His active and inquiring mind constantly sought a clear reasonable explanation of the fundamental nature of matter and energy. He did much very meticulous work in determining the atomic weights of several of the Rare Earth elements. He devised a sodium coulometer and one of the first glass-enclosed reference electrodes. Also he held a patent on a unique method for frosting glass. The results of his research activities have been reported in approximately twenty scholarly papers which were published in the leading chemical journals.

In the classroom, Professor Stewart was a methodical challenging teacher. He emphasized constantly the solving of numerous problems applying the principles being studied.

In Professor Stewart's passing the University has lost a faithful faculty member whose zeal for scholarly inquiry along uncharted paths remains as a pattern to be emulated.

The Committee recommends that this resolution be placed in the minutes of this body and transmitted to the University Faculty and that a copy be sent to the family.

After introductions of amendments to the petition a motion to approve the petition was defeated.

Dr. Weaver, Chairman of the University Faculty Council, presented the following formal report of the Council after which he moved that the report be accepted with the understanding that such acceptance meant endorsement of its contents. The Faculty approved the Report of the University Faculty Council as presented by its Chairman.

The University Faculty Council was organized on July 5, 1962, Dr. Cochran serving as temporary chairman. R. H. Weaver was elected Chairman and J. E. Reeves, Secretary of the Council. Warren Haynes has been elected Vice Chairman. In accordance with the action of the University Faculty, the terms of office of members of the Council were determined by lot. Stephen Diachun, Paul Sears and William S. Ward drew one year terms; W. W. Haynes, John Kuiper, and J. E. Reeves, two year terms; and L. W. Cochran, Douglas Schwartz and R. H. Weaver, three year terms.

In accordance with University Faculty action, the Council recommended membership for the Committee on Curriculum. The appointments were made by President Dickey in a memorandum which was circulated under date of July 30. Terms of appointment were designated as one, two or three years. As the rules of the University Faculty designate that terms of members of standing committees be from January 1, it is the opinion of the Council that membership on the Council and the Curriculum Committee should be from the same date, with those now holding one year appointments serving until December 31, 1963.

The University Faculty Council and the Committee on Curriculum was established by University Faculty action on May 14, 1962. Since the action was not written in such form as to be directly incorporated into the Rules of the University Faculty, the Rules Committee has been asked to submit rule changes which will clarify the routing of course recommendations for consideration of the Committee on Curriculum. In the meantime, in order to avoid undue delay, the Committee will consider all course and curriculum recommendations that have been circulated to the Faculty, allowing a minimum period of 10 days from the date of circulation before consideration, to allow anyone concerned to communicate with the Committee.

The University Faculty action of May 14 directed that: "Faculty Committees shall report through the Council, which will receive, consider and recommend action on committee reports." The Council would like to request that committees who plan to recommend action which will involve changes in the printed rules, consult the Rules Committee before reporting to the Council. This is to avoid actions which may become a part of the minutes but which may be in conflict with the rules or which may be overlooked in future action.

Dr. Weaver then spoke informally to the Faculty of the action taken by the Council during those months the Faculty was not in session. He stated that a number of ideas had resulted from the Faculty Conference at Carnahan House and that the Council will concern itself with those problems which are most important to the Faculty. In this process the Council will develop material to present to the University Faculty for discussion and, in some cases, recommendations. Dr. Weaver stressed that the Council would welcome suggestions at any time from the Faculty about issues of concern to it.

A motion was made and approved to discontinue the required service courses in Physical Education in all curricula in the College of Commerce for all students entering the fall of 1962 and thereafter.
