Planting Television

Anout 7,000 miles of coaxial cable will be added to our plant during the next few years. Inside each cable are six or eight copper tubes—cach pair a broad communications highway over which two television programs or nearly 500 long distance telephone calls can travel. Giant plow-trains will "plant" much of this cable deep in the ground—safe from storm and fire. This construction is but a part of our activity in the television field. Now in an advanced experimental stage are plans to link coaxial cables and high frequency radio relay systems to provide a nationwide television network.


