Naturally, it is the student who does not study that cheats. The good student does not have to cheat consequently has no desire to. However, if only one case of syphilis is discovered, it will have been worth the trouble to save that student from a life of untold suffering, crippled limbs and vital organs, and perhaps insanity.


