My Dear Len

I have waited thus long in vain
for a letter from you, and I suppose I might wait for
ever and still be disappointed if I do not write first,

her first letter has not yet come to hand, I wrote imme-
diately to Mr Kneeland at New Haven, asking him to for-

some one of the family would write every week, I shall
feel myself very much slighted and neglected if you
