Dear Sis:-

I got back from Helena yesterday, and have been busy since then resting up from the trip. We surely had a fine time, that is. Rev. Zundel, our Billings pastor, and myself. The metting there was of the various denominations in the state to confer on Home Mission problems, expecially that of overlapping fields. We Lutherians had some fun. too. Some of the denominations showed a rather nasty spirit toward us, but they were forced to recognize us, for we are numerically the largest body in the state. The convention was assigning some so-called unoccupied fields to different bodies, and the Congregationalists asked for the south side of the city of Billings, claiming that it was unoccupied. Now before this, when the Lutherans were called on to say what part of the state they would like to have. Rev. Zundel said that we would not ask for any definite part. but only wished to remind the brethren of our system of child-baptism, confirmation, etc., and to say that wherever a canvass showed that these unchurched children of the Lutheran Church needed a church or pastoral care, we would feel in duty bound to work there. The convention said that that would be all right with them. I must say that I felt both amused and sore at these fellows assuming such rights to themselves: and even if they had refused to recognize our view-point it would have made no difference to us, for they had absolutely no authority - even though they did make a big noise. But to get back to the matter about the Congregationalists and Billings. They made a nice trap for themselves and then walked into it. They asked for the south side of the city, and when the convention was about to "give" them this, Zundel got up and reminded the bunch of their

approval of our method, and then said that a canvass showed 80 Lutheran families in that part of Billings, and moreover we were just ready to organize. Well, that made the Congregationalists sore, so they tried to get back at us in a snappy way. In a place called Red Lodge there is a large Finnish settlement, and the only way they can be reached is by having a Lutheran (they want no other) minister who can talk Finnish, for the people cannot understand English. The Dengregationalists asked to be assigned this work among the Finns! Zundel told the convention of the plans of the Lutheran Church. Their man said that the Lutheran work would be inadequate because it was too ritualistic(!) and moreover, they needed English work! So the convention "gave" this work to them. Well, this now is the outcome of the spirit they showed: When we are ready to start our work there, they can say nothing against it, for the convention angeed to our working among our people. If they start work we can tell them - and we most certainly shall that they - the denominations /- called us together to talk about cooperation. They agreed not to encroach on any work that was started by any other denomination. And now, if their boasted spirit of fellowship means anything more than a lot of wind, they will not interfere with out work. Have you ever heard of the game called "snipe-hunting"? In that game - played about midnight - one man holds the gag, while the rest go out into the woods to chase the snipes toward him, and he is to catch them in the bag! Well, the Congregationalists are holding the bag. And we, after asserting our rights, did nothing one way or the other.

The city of Helena (accent on the <u>first</u> syllable!) is quite pretty.

It is in the mountains, and the main part of the city is in a "gully" - we would call it a valley! It is a progressive place, with good business. The postals I sent will give you a good idea of it.

On Monday I got some good news. I had been worrying about my lodging oblem, but found that it is solved for me. One of the members of the uncil told me that they are going to give thirty days' notice to the esent occupants of the parsonage, and I can have it them. And too, he s of the opinion that I ought to have it rent-free! But even if I have pay rent, it will be less than I'd have to pay for a good room. I sure s tickled. The parsonage is gight behind the church, and is a little ttage of about fouf or five rooms. So I'll have to get come furniture r my establishment! Would Raymond know of any firm where I could get at I believe is called knock-down furniture? That is, furniture that mes in pieces, and you assemble them, and then stain the pieces. If he es, please send me the name as soon as possible, so that I can order some. or I think that that would be cheaper than getting others. I shall have ce arrangements and comfortable: a sitting-room, a study, a bed-room, id then the kitchen. In there I'll fix up a little work-bench, and take rt of my recreation in making things for myself and for the church. I ive already surprized some of the people here with my "mechanical" ability. lock has long needed repairing, and is very intricate, but I fixed it up that it doesn't get "jimmed" any more.

I am feeling much better than I did when I last wrote Mother. The rouble in my throat is gone. It was due partly to the effects of the operaton, and partly to some abnormally warm days here. That then is no longer othering me. So Sis, there will be no need for my giving up the work hore least for a few days! So don't worry about me. I am getting along nicely. Well, I must stop for this time. Tell Mother that I'll write tonight tomorrow in answer to her letter. Best of love to all at home, especially my babies. How are they? Is little Alethea well again?
