UK seeks volunteers for testing HIV vaccine

Research program: Doctor says participants will not be injected with HIV virus in study

UK officials announced Ffi-day that the university has been selected to participate in a major HIV vaccine-research

Richard Greenberg, principle investigator and pro-fessor in the College of Medi-cine, said the university was nosen because of its track

chosen because of its track record in research. "UK has had experience in over 50 trials with HIV-infected individuals and recently was awarded a grant from the gov-ernment for a full service HIV clinic." Greenberg said. The vaccine, developed by Merck & Co. Pharmaceutical Corp., is made up of DNA,

whereas traditional HIV vaccines are made up of protein, Greenberg said.

Instead of generating antibodies, the Merck vaccine strengthens the body's host defenses, specifically the Cytotox.

"This difference is the new strategy of HIV vaccines," he added.

Greenberg said the function of Cytotoxic Tlymphocytes in the human body is comparable to the structure of a Pac-Man video game.

Avison explained, inflammatory and non-inflammatory. The pathways have different reactions to the drug cocktail used to treat HIV and AIDS patients with dementia, he said.

The magnetic resonance equipment lets researchers distinguish the pathways, Avison said. Berger said it is hoped that the studies will someday provide the means to predict which patients should be treated with which drugs. These studies are not the only ones UK researchers are conducting that concern HIV and AIDS. Berger said.

"The University of Kentucky is privileged to have over Sr million from the National Institute of Health alone for AIDS research," he said.

At least three more seminars are planned. Berger said he hopes to educate the community attract new subjects for studies and possibly gain additional funding.

The Graduate Council also considers extenuating circumstances that may prolong the dissertation work.

A completed doctoral degree includes completing all graduate work, passing a comprehensive exam that shows knowledge of the field and the subject of the dissertation, writing the dissertation itself and finally the final examination — the student defending the dissertation.

Blackwell said the accomplishment of completing a dissertation illustrates considerable skill on behalf of the student.

"(It shows) the ability to maintain.

ment of completing a unservation trates considerable skill on behalf of the student.

"(It shows) the ability to maintain a sustained argument in a long and complicated document," she said.

Blackwell said students must incorporate writing skills clearly, separate their opinions from the facts, organize their thoughts logically and analyze information in creative ways.

Completing the project

Though completing a dissertation is a lengthy process, Brent Garrett shows that it can be done. He defended his dissertation in January and said he could not feel any better about it.
"There is certainly a huge reduction in pressure, knowing I don't have

to work on something every evening after work." said Garrett, a graduate student in the public policy and administration program.

But he said he dealt with his own struggles while completing his dissertation. His roles as husband, father and employee didn't make the process any easier, he said. After his house calmed down each night he spent two to three hours working on it, in addition to devoting his weekends to the research project.

After two years, he completed it. Garrett said he knew the main idea for his project, but it was difficult to outline the details.



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

Student body girds for coming elections

Democracy is at work — sort of. The filing date is today, and only two candidates have announced their plans to run for Student Government president — Tim Robinson,

Democracy is at work — sort of. The filing date is today, and only two candidates have announced their plans to run for Student Government president — Tim Robinson, the current SG president, and Ben Hayes, a history junior.

It is good that someone decided to challenge Robinson, thus preventing him from running an uncontested campaign. This is not to imply anything about Robinson, of course, but just to recognize how important contested elections are at every level. It will be Robinson's second term if he wins reelection, which begs the question: Should the student body presidency be a one-term gig?

Robinson has been a competent and qualified president throughout the past year — we supported many of his actions on these pages — but this isn't the U.S. Congress. Student Government is an institution set up, at least in part, to offer students experience and opportunity, both of which are limited when the same administration serves consecutive terms.

The thought never crossed anyone's mind until Jimmy Glenn's second term. The Senate then voted to limit all future presidents to two terms. So, despite being term-limited at the outset, Robinson is now following the same path as Glenn, which means that if he wins reelection, next year's graduating seniors will have seen only two SG (or SGA, depending on your preference) presidents.

What is the precedent that is being set by this policy for the future of student-run government? Will other students turn away from the opportunity because of the difficulty inherent in running against an incumbent? Will future student body presidents spend a large part of their term running for reelection?

This is not to say that a one-year term is enough time for a student to make an impact on the lives of other students. And allowing multiple year terms will lead to much of the political problems that should not be associated with Student Government elections — the blatant breaking of spending limits, the increase use of outside money and the possible creation of a party system. the blatant breaking of spending limits, the increase use of outside money and the

This is not what UK needs, and it can be preemptively halted by limiting an SG president to one term.

For now, though, all we can hope for is an above-the-board race that focuses on issues facing students and not on campaign violations. Perhaps this cause can be furthered if more students get to the SG office toot sweet and file to run.

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
