WASHINGTON — The campaign for control of the Senate, notable mostly for its excesses of money and mudslinging, wound down as Democrats and Republicans made their final pitches and then waited anxiously for the voters' response today.

Democrats, with history and the election-year arithmetic on their side, were trying to regain the majority that was swept away six years ago in the landslide that carried Ronald Reagan into the White House.

Republicans — still hoping Rea-gan can rally the public one more time with his "last hurrah" blitz — nonetheless were talking more and more about the long odds facing GOP candidates.

In person in California and Nevada, on television screens around the country and even via automatic telephone machines that delivered pre-recorded personal appeals, Reagan seemed to be everywhere at once urging the public not to let him dwwn.



All-campus forum only way to decide UK alcohol policy

Alcohol, or the lack of it in the dormitory, has been the one issue on campus this semester that has provoked student response.

SGA Senator at Large David Botkins and his ambiguous group SLAP (Student Leaders Against Prohibition) have pushed the issue through the Student Government Association senate and to the halls of the state capitol in search of an attorney general's opinion.

Now the issue of allowing 21-year-olds to drink seems to have reached a sort of climax.

It has finally reached the desks of Joseph Burch, acting vice chancellor for student affairs, and Art Gallaher, chancellor for the Lexington campus.

It's about time.

SGA President Donna Greenwell said the issue probably will now take one of two routes.

The proposal by Botkins, to allow 21-year-olds the right to drink in the privacy of their residence hall rooms, will go directly to the Board of Trustees, where it will face inevitable defeat.

President Otis A. Singletary will establish a committee consisting of faculty, students and possibly trustee members to devise a consistent alcohol policy for the entire UK campus.

UK drug expert criticizes state survey

A nationally recognized drug expert at UK says a "simple-minded" approach flaws a survey on drug and alcohol abuse among Kentucky students.

Kentucky is in the middle of its first statewide survey of drug and alcohol abuse among junior high, middle school and high school students.

Education officials say the survey will provide valuable data for drug-prevention programs.

But Richard Clayton, a UK sociology professor, objected that the survey does not ask about tobacco use, and said the findings will be deceptive because of the way some questions are phrased.

The survey was drawn up by Kentucky State University with assistance from an advisory committee.

John Bruce, education research director at KSU and coordinator of the drug project, said the purpose "is to identify the scope and depth of alcohol and drug abuse among students . . . and provide data to local school districts so they can develop community awareness programs."

Voters prepare to choose 100th Congress

The candidates submitted their case to the voters yester-day in the tense struggle for control of the Senate, the shining prize in today's elections to pick the nation's 100th Congress and three dozen governors. President Reagan played his role as Chief Campaigner to the end, stumping for GOP candidates in two western states in a bid to keep the Senate from falling into hostile Democratic hands in his final two years in office.

Visiting Nevada for GOP Senate candidate Jim Santini, the president said, "It's time we got the facts out about Jim's opponent. I don't think the firerely independent people of Nevada want as their senator a tax-and-spend liberal who is against a balanced budget amendment."

Then it was on to Costa Mesa, Calift, where the president holstered his partisan rhetoric in favor of a sentimental speech marking the end of what he termed "the last campaign."

Most of the attention nationally was focused on the Senate races. Republicans hold a 53-47 edge in the current Senate, but are defending 22 of the 34 seats on the ballot.

Jacobsen pleads for Americans' release

WIESBADEN, West Germany — David Jacobsen yes-terday told of his great joy in being released from more than 17 months of captivity but said other Americans still held by Lebanese kidnappers "are in hell" and must be set

free.

Jacobsen, 55, arrived at the U.S. military air base in Wiesbaden one day after being freed by his Shiite Moslem captors. Anglican Church envoy Terry Waite accompanied Jacobsen, who was serving as administrator of the American University hospital in Beirut when he was abducted on May 28, 1985.

Waite, who has negotiated to free the hostages since last year, said he would keep on seeking the release of five other Americans who are among 19 foreigners still missing in Lebanon.




