'Incredible scientific advances': Leading doctor and researcher discusses the role of technology in medicine at annual convocation

Health care is a business

Health care is a business. Like most businesses, health care is utilizing new technology and the Internet to foster amazing advances in the field of medicine.

That was the topic at the UK
School of Medicine's annual convo-cation Thursday at the Chandler
Medical Center. Jordan J. Cohen
M.D., president and chief executive
officer of the Association of Ameri-

can Medical Colleges, delivered the

"The convocation is a very important event for the medical school. It provides the school an opportunity to provide some recognition for outstanding student and faculty performance." Cohen said.

Cohen graduated from Yale University and Harvard Medical School, completing his postgraduate training in internal medicine at Boston City Hospital.

Cohen is the author of more

than 100 publications and is the editor of Kidney International's Nephrology Forum.

His 40-year career in academic medicine has included positions at some of the most prestigious institutions in the country.

Most recently Cohen served as dean of the medical school and professor of medicine at the State University of New York at Stony Brook, and president for the medical staff at University Hospital, Stony Brook.

He addressed various issues at the convocation, such as the future of medicine, medical residency legislation, HMOs, choosing medicine as a career and the use of animals in experimental settings.

Cohen spoke highly of UK's ambition of becoming a top-20 research institution.

"I think that UK's goal is a very appropriate one given the fact that we are on the threshold of so many incredible scientific advances in medicine." he said. "With the completion of the Human Genome Project and all of the promise that information technology has of improving the health care system, the opportunity of advancing the quality of care

In their own words: Two Nicauraguan factory workers come to Lexington to speak about sweatshop conditions in their workplace

In the Nicauraguan Chentex factory where Zenayda Torres worked for four years, it isn't out of the ordinary to find fetuses in the bathroom.

Working conditions are so bad, she said, that pregnant workers miscarry after being forced to lift heavy packages.

Torres and her foner to the state of the factory, which produces a paper to lexington Thursdup to the state of the factory, which produces apparel for the department store Kohls.

UK and Transylvania chapters of United Students Against Sweatshops rallied around the women, who sat behind sewing machines on the court house lawn to simulate the factory work.

The National Labor Com-The National Labor Committee invited the women to tour the United States in hopes that their stories will encourage Kohls to intervene at the factory.

kohls could not be reached for comment.

Torres, aided by a translator, explained in her native Spanish the deplorable working conditions at the factory.

Torres said there are few bathrooms and many poorly stored chemicals at the factory.

Chentex management is try-ing to squelch the efforts of the newly-formed workers union, said Charlie Kernigan, NLC director.

mion requested an eight-ent-per-hour wage increase but Chentex denied their request, firing 700 workers who associated with the union.

"When the workers tried to increase their wages by the tiniest amounts, to climb out of mis-

ery and at least into poverty, they were fired," Kernigan said. Barbara Briggs, NLC repre-sentative, said if the union is not recognized, it will set a terrible precedent. Kernigan applauded the stu-

precedent.

Kernigan applauded the students' activism for this issue, calling USAS the strongest human rights movement today.

Susan Roth, a biochemistry junior, helped lead the rally. Ste said many people still do not understand why she and several other UK students, as well as students across the nations, put themselves and their criminal records on the line last year in sweatshop protests.

The action is expected to make abortion in the United States more accessible and more private.

66 dead in Greek ferry wreck, captain arrested

'You have to be blind not to see it': Wreck survivors say crew was watching soccer when ferry struck rock that could be seen for miles

PAROS, Greece — Greek authorities on Wednesday arrested the captain and four crew members of a ferry that struck a rocky outcrop marked by a light beacon that could be seen for seven miles. At least 66 people were killed.

Searches continued throughout the night for possible survivors. Some survivors said crew members were watching a soccer match on television Tuesday night when the ship, holding more than 500 people, went aground in a gale in the Aegean Sea Just two miles "I Joked with my husband. "Who's driving the ship?" Said Christa Licchinski, a pregnant, 37-year-old from Seeheim, Germany, who was traveling with her husband — a Lufthansa plot—and their 4-year-old son.

Greece's lead prosecutor, Panagiotis Dimopoulos, said

he would seek indictments for he crew on murder charges.
"It is inexplicable how the ship collided with a well-known rock that carries a light visible from a distance of seven miles," coast guard chief Andreas Sirigos said. "You have to be blind not to see it." Survivors described a scene of panic and chaos as passengers tried to slip off the sinking ship into the swelling seas.

It was unclear how many people were aboard, and how many of them were foreigners. At least 473 people were rescued, including two Americans, authorities said.






