

March 29, 1914

The faculty of State University met in special session in the faculty room in the Gymnasium building, Friday, Mch. 20, 1914, at 3:45 P.M., those present being: President Barker, Professors Anderson, Boyd, Brown, Brumage, Carrel, Dantzler, Davis, Gillis, Good, Lieut. Gullion, Dean Hamilton, Professor Hooper, Judge Lafferty, Professors Mathews, Melcher, Miller, Noe, Peter, Pryor, Roberts, Rowe, Dr. Terrell, Prof. Terrell, Dr. Tuthill and Prof. Webb.

The meeting was called to order by the President, and after the roll-call and reading of the minutes of the last meeting, the subject of hazing was continued.

President Barker stated that they would consider the motion made by Prof Miller at the previous meeting of March 6th. After some discussion, Professor Anderson made the substitute motion that a general rule be passed prohibiting hazing in this institution.

The motion was seconded and carried by a majority.

President Barker then read a recommendation from Mr. Hall of the Y.M.C.A., with reference to the attendance on chapel services of members of the faculty and the students, as follows:

Inasmuch as attendance at the weekly convocation is not compulsory, and realizing the necessity of removing all hindrances that prevent voluntary attendance, we, the faculty of the University of Kentucky, do hereby resolve

That - Beginning with Wednesday, March 25, 1914, all recitation rooms, reading rooms, public offices, libraries, drafting rooms and laboratories on the campus must be emptied of students and no meetings called by members of the faculty or students allowed therein, during the weekly convocation occurring from 9:45 to 10:40 A.M. each Wednesday.

That no meetings or gatherings of students must be held in the halls of any building or outdoors on the campus during the above hour.

That candy or refreshment sales must not be held during the above hour in any building or at any entrance.

Prof. Anderson offered a substitute motion with reference to faculty attendance on chapel as follows:

RESOLVED that this faculty use every effort to induce students to attend the regular weekly chapel exercises and that no regular university work or meetings shall be assigned or encouraged during these regular chapel periods.

All class meetings or societies are prohibited during chapel.

This motion was duly seconded and carried.

Motion was made by Dr. Kastle, seconded and carried, that ^{hereafter} twenty members of the faculty shall constitute a quorum.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
