Movement among the Moulders

Three hundred of the journeymen moulders publish a card in which they protest determinedly against the reduction of 30 per cent. on their wages, by a combination of nine out of eleven employers, who conduct the foundery business in this city.

They held a meeting on Tuesday Evening, which was unanimously attended, and stern Resolutions to maintain the Protest, were passed. Yesterday a large number of them turned out in procession, and visited the founderies and sales rooms, and if a statement in the Nonpareil be correct, every moulder in the city was yesterday pledged that after last night he would resist combination
